SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

AFI 91-207, 1 October 1995, is supplemented as follows:

1.3.4. (Added) (11TH). Unit commanders, agency chiefs, or first sergeants will: Conduct a unit newcomers safety briefing with all newly assigned military and Department of the Air Force (DAF)/ Non-Appropriated Funds (NAF) civilian personnel within 7 days of arrival on station, or beginning of employment with the United States Air Force. Unit commanders, agency chiefs may delegate this requirement to the assigned unit safety representative/manager. As a minimum, the briefing will include the topics listed in attachment 1. The newcomers safety briefing is in addition to Course II, *Local Conditions* (AFI 91-207, paragraph A2.2). Completion of the unit newcomers safety briefing and Course II, will be documented at the discretion of the assigned unit/supervisor.

A2.2.2. All newly assigned military and DAF/NAF civilian personnel will attend Course II, within 30 days of arrival on station.
