ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES PROGRAM

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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AFI 34-219, 9 September 1998 is supplemented as follows:

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

The revision of this publication is to meet the format standards required by the Air Force. No content material has changed. Some required format changes have been made to allow for the conversion process.

1.1. Each authorized sales outlet will keep a current copy of AFI 34-219 and this supplement available for review by all prospective customers.

1.1.2. All persons including Air Force members, their family members and their bonafide guests must be 21 years of age or older to purchase and consume alcoholic beverages. For the purpose of this supplement the term alcoholic beverage encompasses liquor, beer, wine or wine coolers.

1.1.3. All employees selling or serving alcoholic beverages will verify a customer's age utilizing appropriate identification; e.g., military ID or driver's license.

1.4. Alcoholic beverages will not be sold or allowed to be consumed by persons who appear to be, or give the appearance of being, intoxicated. Managers of each facility will ensure proper controls are established and enforced. Employees will immediately report to management any persons they believe to be intoxicated.

1.5.1. The Wing Commander will approve the hours during which alcoholic drinks are sold in Services' activities and coordinate those for AAFES activities listed in the primary instruction and this supplement. A copy of the approval or coordination will be maintained on file at each activity.

2.1. Alcoholic beverages may be sold for on premise consumption in the following locations by Services' and AAFES's employees:

Pacific Coast Club

Rod and Gun Club

Golf Course Snack Bar

Bowling Center

Intramural Athletic Fields (beer only)

Other Services' operated snack bars and refreshment stands operated by Services' employees; e.g., Open House/Air Shows, American Heritage Week, fund raising events and approved special events.

Robin Hood (AAFES) (beer and wine coolers)

2.1.1. Alcoholic beverages will not be sold or consumed at any youth athletic activity or event.

2.1.2.1. The lodging fund may sell alcoholic beverages, for on premise consumption, in VOQs, VAQs and temporary lodging facilities (TLFs). Sale of miniatures and beer is authorized in rooms, suites and at the main desk.

2.1.6. In addition to those areas listed in the basic instruction and this supplement, alcoholic beverages may also be served, possessed and consumed in the following areas:

Base Picnic Areas: Private parties or groups may serve and consume beer in these areas. The beer may not be sold under any circumstances.

Recreation Center: With written approval from the Wing Commander, private groups and parties may serve and consume beer or wine at the center. The club may cater alcoholic beverages during special functions when authorized, in writing, by the Wing Commander.

Family living quarters

Dormitories, including bachelor quarters (officer and NCO), transient and temporary lodging facilities, per paragraph 1.1.2 of this supplement.

3.2. Alcoholic beverages may be sold for off premise consumption in the following locations:

AAFES Class Six/Shoppette (all alcoholic beverages)

AAFES Main Store (wine)

Pacific Coast Club: Beer, wine coolers and other commercially packaged alcoholic beverages with less than 7 percent content, when AAFES outlets are closed and at prices no less than AAFES. Packaged beer and wine sales incidental to party contracts or take out food and beverage operations are exempt from this restriction. Party contracts may include keg beer.
