This publication applies to all personnel who sell, serve, purchase, and consume alcohol on Eielson Air Force Base. It also applies to the Air National Guard and Reserve units and their respective members when on Eielson Air Force Base.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

Clarification of wording in opening paragraph and paragraphs **1.1.2.2. (Added)** and **2.1.6.2.8. (Added)** Changed "billeting" to "lodging" in paragraph **2.1.3.** A bar (|) indicates revision from the previous edition.

AFI 34-219, 9 September 1998, is supplemented as follows:

1.1. These restrictions apply to sale, use, and possession of alcoholic beverages on Eielson AFB.

1.1.2.1. (Added) (354FW). Military or nonmilitary personnel, at least 21 years of age, may purchase, possess, and consume alcoholic beverages on Eielson AFB. Personnel who have alcoholic beverages in their room (21 years of age or older) have the responsibility to ensure it is not consumed by personnel (roommates or guests) under the legal drinking age of 21 years. Individuals who sell or dispense alcoholic beverages must be 21 years of age or older.

1.1.2.2. (Added) (354FW). Alaska state law recognizes the Dram Shop Theory of civil liability. Personnel who serve alcoholic beverages and allow an intoxicated person to further consume alcoholic beverages may be held liable for damage or harm brought about as a result. Squadron commanders, party monitors, and authorized servers of alcoholic beverages must make sure no alcoholic beverages are served to individuals who reach or appear to be reaching the point of intoxication.

1.3.4. Managers of Services Squadron facilities must submit a report of any patron's unfavorable drinking-related incident through the Services Squadron commander to patron's unit commander or senior employee supervisor. Activity supervisors will annotate all drinking-related incidents in the manager's log book, including name, organization, and club card number of persons involved. Individuals who have patronage privileges suspended by the Services Squadron commander as a result of drinking-related mis-

conduct, may have their privileges reinstated by the Services Squadron commander after a personal conference with the individual(s) involved, sponsor (if appropriate), and the unit commander.

2.1. The sale and dispensing of alcoholic beverages is limited to the facilities indicated below for on-premise consumption.

2.1.1. Yukon and Aurora Clubs (Bldgs 2225 and 5223).

2.1.2. Arctic Nite Bowling Center.

2.1.3. Lodging Office (Bldg 2270) for consumption in lodging quarters.

2.1.6.1. (Added) The sale and dispensing of malt beverages and wine are limited to the Services Squadron facilities indicated for on-premise consumption only:

2.1.6.1.1. (Added) Birch Lake Lodge (military recreation area).

2.1.6.1.2. (Added) Ravenwood Ski Lodge.

2.1.6.1.3. (Added) Skeet & Trap Range (clubhouse only).

2.1.6.1.4. (Added) Services concession booths operating in support of special events.

2.1.6.1.5. (Added) Base athletic fields not involved in youth sports functions.

2.1.6.2. (Added) Consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized at the following facilities and locations for on-premise consumption only:

2.1.6.2.1. (Added) Private family and bachelor quarters

2.1.6.2.2. (Added) Par Course picnic area

2.1.6.2.3. (Added) Ravenwood Ski Lodge picnic area

2.1.6.2.4. (Added) Chena River Park

2.1.6.2.5. (Added) Birch Lake military recreation area

2.1.6.2.6. (Added) Bear Lake Pavilion

2.1.6.2.7. (Added) Grayling Lake Pavilion

2.1.6.2.8. (Added) The 18 FS, 353 CTS, 355 FS and other areas as approved by the installation commander.

2.1.6.2.9. (Added) (354FW). Others as approved by the Support Group commander on a one-time basis. Units, groups, or organizations which desire to use these areas for social events must submit a letter. Forward requests to 354 SVS/SVR to arrive no later than 10 days before the event.

2.1.6.2.10. (Added) Alcoholic beverages will not be sold or dispensed in the Bowling Center during youth leagues or when any youth-sponsored bowling event is in progress.

3.2.1. Alcoholic beverages will only be sold and served to authorized personnel. Guests of club members are authorized to be served and to purchase alcoholic beverages if they are 21 years of age or older. Sales of alcoholic beverages are restricted to on-premise consumption except sales at the Class Six and AAFES

retail outlets which conduct sales for off-premise consumption. Club may sell packaged beer and wine coolers for off-premise consumption when AAFES-operated retail outlets are closed.
