This supplement applies to all Department of Defense (DOD), civilian, active duty, National Guard, Air Force Reserve, and allied (other nations) personnel assigned, temporarily or permanently to Elmendorf AFB.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

AFI 34-219, 9 September 1998, is supplemented as follows:

1.1.2.1. (Added) (3WG). No person under 21 years of age is authorized to purchase, possess, be served, or consume alcoholic beverages on Elmendorf AFB. Persons 21 years of age or older will not furnish an alcoholic beverage to a person under 21 years of age on Elmendorf AFB. Failure to obey these regulations is a violation of the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 92 (AS 04.16.050).

1.1.2.2. (Added) (3WG). Personnel aged 18-20 are authorized in club lounge areas. Active duty need not be accompanied. Club members and active duty personnel area eligible to sponsor all other individuals aged 18-20 into the club lounges. Sponsors will sign statements of responsibility for their guests (AS 04.16.049).

1.1.5.1. (Added) (3WG). Squadron commanders will administer appropriate discipline to violators of restrictions under Article 92, Uniform Code of Military Justice. The 3rd Services Commander will bar offenders from the Services activity where the offense occurred for no less then 6 months. Security Forces personnel will issue civilian offenders a federal citation. Sponsors of civilian offenders will be responsible for escorting the civilian offender off base. In the case a sponsor cannot be located, club management will ensure civilian offenders are provided a ride to their residence by taxi.

1.3.1.1. (Added) (3WG). No person will serve alcoholic beverages to persons they consider to be intoxicated, or close to intoxication (AS 04.16.030).

1.3.4.1. (Added) (3WG). Services employees will report incidents of underage alcohol consumption to the 3rd Services Commander. Security Forces will provide a copy of any incident report to the squadron commanders of any and all individuals involved in incidents, to include sponsors of dependents and sponsors of civilians.

2.1.6.1. (Added) (3WG). Facilities where alcoholic beverages may be sold on Elmendorf AFB are listed below. The list also identifies areas where consumption of alcoholic beverages are authorized. In addition to the facilities listed, the SPTG Commander may grant authority for SVS to sell alcohol, malt and wine at special events, such as the Annual Open House (AS 04.21.040).

*Unit operated lounges may only **SERVE** malt beverages and wine. They are not authorized to operate a resale activity or charge any type of fee.

**If function is catered by Services, then alcohol, malt, and wine may be sold/served

2.1.6.2. (Added) (3WG). Alcoholic beverages are prohibited at all base facilities or areas that are not specifically designated or authorized. The SPTG Commander through the Services Commander must first approve possession and consumption of any alcoholic beverage in public facilities not included in the listing above.

2.1.6.3. (Added) (3WG). The sponsoring commander will designate specific individuals to monitor the consumption of alcoholic beverages at unit social events held on the installation.

3.2.3.1. (Added) (3WG). Alaska Statute 04.21.040(b) states, “Alcoholic beverages received on a federal reservation may not be removed for resale or public use outside the federal reservation.” Therefore, the following notice will be placed in all Package Store Outlets: **“NOTICE: ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TAKEN OFF BASE ARE NOT FOR RESALE OR PUBLIC USE. VIOLATIONS OF ALASKA STATUTE 04.11.010 COULD RESULT IN UP TO 1 YEAR IMPRISONMENT, \$5,000 FINE, OR BOTH. IN ADDITION, VIOLATORS MUST SERVE A MINIMUM OF 10 CONSECUTIVE DAYS OF IMPRISONMENT, ALASKA STATUTE 04.16.200(d).”** To provide clarification, “private use” would be use in one’s own home with one’s friends. “Public use,” in order to differentiate it from “resale” would involve running a business establishment of some sort and, as inducement for customers, giving away alcohol which had been purchased on a federal reservation. The statute would prohibit that kind of “public use.”
