OF AIR FORCE PERSONNEL**

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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AFI 36-2903, 1 November 2001 and AMC Supplement 1, 12 September 2002 are supplemented as follows. This supplement establishes uniform wear policy and personal appearance standards for MacDill Air Force Base (AFB) personnel. It applies to personnel assigned, attached, or on temporary duty to MacDill AFB.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision updates wing designation, approved organizational baseball caps, and approved no-hat areas. It implements AMC Sup 1 to AFI 36-2903 and the wear of a physical training (PT) uniform for the 6th Communications Squadron (6 CS). It also implements the wear of a distinctive civilian uniform for the 6th Transportation Squadron, Vehicle Operations Flight, Distinguished Visitor Transportation Element (6 TRANS/LGTO), the 6 CS Public Address and Visual Information Support teams, and the 6th Services Squadron (6 SVS). This revision adds approved unit undershirts with logos, dictates the dress code for the Diner's Reef Dining Facility and Flight Kitchen, and it includes pictures of approved organizational baseball caps and squadron undershirts. **A bar (|) indicates a change since the last edition.**

Table 1.1. Commanders Responsibilities.

Installation Commanders	<p>Military personnel assigned to 6 CS are authorized to wear a PT uniform while performing squadron exercise or morale enhancement programs. The PT uniform shall consist of a gray, crew neck tee-shirt with the squadron logo printed on the upper left side, dark blue athletic-style shorts with COMM in white letters on the bottom of the left leg, and athletic footwear. Shirts and shorts will be provided to squadron members at no cost. Members must still adhere to grooming standards in accordance with AFI 36-2903. The 6 CS PT uniform will be worn as directed by the 6 CS Commander (6 CS/CC).</p> <p>Military personnel assigned to the 6 CS Public Address and Visual Information Support teams are authorized to wear a distinctive civilian uniform. This uniform shall consist of a dark blue polo shirt with the 6 CS text embroidered on the top left area of the shirt, khaki or brown colored cotton/polyester slacks, dark colored belt, and dark brown or black dress footwear. The shirt shall be tucked in at all times. Shirts will be provided to the Public Address and Visual support team members at no cost. Members must still adhere to grooming standards in accordance with AFI 36-2903. The 6 CS distinctive civilian uniform will be worn as directed by 6 CS/CC.</p> <p>Military personnel assigned to 6 TRANS/LGTO are authorized to wear a distinctive civilian uniform. Both male and female personnel will wear pleated khaki Dockers slacks, brown leather or elasticized belt, and a Tropical/Hawaiian-style shirt. Shirt will be worn outside or neatly tucked inside slacks. Brown dress/business shoes with tan/brown socks (without design) will be worn. Members must still adhere to grooming standards in accordance with AFI 36-2903. The 6 TRANS civilian uniform will be worn as directed by the 6 TRANS Commander.</p>
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	<p>Military personnel, appropriated, and non-appropriated funded civilian employees assigned to 6 SVS will wear a unit-funded shirt of uniformed color with squadron logo. The shirt will be the uniform of the day for all squadron members. Official military functions/formations will be attended in military uniform. Members must still adhere to grooming standards in accordance with AFI 36-2903.</p>
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NOTES:

1. Military personnel assigned to the Recreation Support Flight (6 SVS/SVRA) are authorized to wear a distinctive civilian uniform. Both male and female personnel will wear navy polyester/wool slacks or shorts with a blue shirt. Shirts will be neatly tucked inside slacks or shorts. Black military (low quarters) shoes or black coaches shoes will be worn with slacks. Black or white coaches shoes must be worn with shorts. Black socks (without design) must be worn with slacks and white socks (without design) must be worn with shorts. Socks will not be higher than mid calf (no knee huggers). Belt must be worn with slacks that have belt loops. Belt is dark blue, cotton web or elastic, solid or woven with matching silver tip and buckle. Squadron hats will be worn when outdoors. Personnel are authorized to wear the red, white, and blue jacket at anytime indoors or outside. They are an official part of the uniform. Official military functions/formations will be attended in military uniform. The 6 SVS civilian uniform is the normal duty uniform, however, the 6 SVS Commander may direct wear of the military uniform for special events, activities, or observances.

Note 2. The omission of a specific item or appearance does not automatically permit its wear.

Note 2. Officers will wear subdued metal grade insignia on the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) cap during deployments, field training, or mobility exercises.

Note 3. The subdued 6th Air Mobility Wing (6 AMW) patch will be sewn on the left breast pocket of the BDU (except for those personnel who are required to wear a duty badge). Morale patches are not authorized to be worn on the BDU (no patches are authorized to be worn above the name tape on the BDU).

Line 6. When on base while in garrison, organizational baseball cap may be worn with the BDU as prescribed in **Attachment 11 (Added)** of this supplement. Requests for organizational baseball caps will be submitted through the 6th Mission Support Squadron, Customer Service Section (6 MSS/DPMPSC) to the 6 AMW Commander (6 AMW/CC) for approval. The BDU cap will be worn as required by AFI 36-2903.

Line 11. Undershirts may have MacDill specific squadron/unit designated emblems in accordance with AFI 36-2903 and as prescribed in **Attachment 12 (Added)** of this supplement. Requests for squadron/unit-designated undershirts will be submitted through 6 MSS/DPMPSC to 6 AMW/CC for approval.

Line 9. When on base while in garrison, organizational baseball caps may be worn with the BDU as prescribed in **Attachment 11 (Added)** of this supplement. Requests for organizational baseball caps will be submitted through the 6 MSS/DPMPSC to the 6 AMW/CC for approval. The BDU cap will be worn as required by AFI 36-2903.

Line 14. Undershirts may have squadron/unit designated emblems in accordance with AFI 36-2903 and as prescribed in **Attachment 12 (Added)** of this supplement. Requests for squadron/unit designated undershirts will be submitted through 6 MSS/DPMPSC to 6 AMW/CC for approval.

		X	Designated no-hat areas are prescribed in Attachment 13 (Added) . Personnel assigned to the 6th Civil Engineer Squadron (6 CES) and 6 CS may remove their headgear when directly engaged in job related tasks at a job site unless required for safety reasons.

3.1. Personnel assigned to the fuels maintenance checkpoint operations, fuels mobility support section, and hazardous material pharmacy are authorized to wear the olive green or blue coveralls while performing assigned tasks in their immediate work area but not to include refueling operations. Personnel may also wear the yellow disposable coveralls while handling hazardous material.

3.1.1. The US Navy watch (stocking) cap is authorized for wear from 1 November through 31 March when the forecasted temperature will be below 45 degrees Fahrenheit. It may only be worn with BDUs or flight suits on the flightline and in the munitions storage area.

3.1.2. Personnel assigned to the vehicle operation, fire truck maintenance, refueling maintenance, and mobile maintenance work centers are authorized to wear the olive green coveralls in the immediate work area to include roadside repairs.

3.1.3. (Added) The 6th Operations Support Squadron, Air Traffic Controllers (6 OSS/OSAT), and 6 CS personnel in the following duty sections are authorized to wear the MA-1 flight jacket: Telephone Maintenance (outside plant), Antenna Maintenance, Ground Radio Maintenance, Navigational Aid Maintenance, and Cable Maintenance.

3.1.4. (Added) Parkas are not authorized for wear with any uniform.

3.1.5. (Added) The olive green sweater or sleeping shirt is authorized for wear under the BDUs from 01 November through 31 March. It may only be worn in the immediate work area.

3.1.6. (Added) Reflective tape, jackets, and armbands are authorized for wear on the flightline with BDUs or in any uniform for safety reasons while riding a bicycle.

3.1.7. (Added) Protective hair/head coverings are authorized. They may only be worn when actual work is being performed that requires protection from the elements of work (paint, oil, grease, sprays, etc.).

3.1.8. (Added) Flight maintenance and vehicle maintenance flight personnel may wear the olive green sweatband in lieu of the BDU/baseball cap while working on the flightline and in the main vehicle maintenance shop.

The following is a list of designated no-hat areas authorized at MacDill Air Force Base.

Flightline Area

The flightline and flightline apron/ramp up to the facility doors facing the flightline. This area extends from Bldg 524 (Wash Rack Storage Bldg) to the Squadron Operations (Bldg 53). Parking lots and areas between hangars are not included.

Medical Group

The area between the loading dock facility door of Bldgs 711, 696, and 715 while performing official duties.

The exit from the Radiology Section of Bldg 711 to the rear entrance of Bldg 697.

The area between Bldg 711 and Bldg 719 (Inpatient Records and Third Party Collections).

The covered walkway between the main facility and the Dental Clinic.

The covered ambulance bay located outside the emergency room.

Support GroupCivil Engineer Squadron

Within the fenced area of the following Civil Engineer facilities: Bldgs P33, P29, P11, P12, 1072, 66, 865, 1050, and facility 95.

Services Squadron

Covered walkway between Bldgs 65 and 72.

Logistics GroupSupply Squadron

The Fuels Management Flight (Bldg 1062) area leading to and including the refueler parking lot.

For individuals loading and unloading vehicles: South side of Bldg 49, outside dock area, and parking lot adjacent to the dock.

The fuels hydrant pump house areas: Bldgs 75 and 77.

The cryogenics storage area: Bldgs 1067 and 1072.

The fuels mobility warehouses, including the dock area between Bldgs 1051 and 1053.

Transportation Squadron

Vehicle Operations Compound within the fenced area of Bldg 176.

Vehicle Maintenance Compound within the fenced area of Bldg 500.

The dress code for the Diner's Reef Dining Facility and the Flight Kitchen will not allow

Clothing that is lewd, obscene, or has profane words or drawings

Articles of clothing that might tend to create disorder or reflect support for an organization or individual who advocates the overthrow of the US government

Wearing as outer-garments articles of clothing that were specifically designed as undergarments

Dress or grooming that might tend to cause a problem of sanitation due to lack of cleanliness

Tank tops, bare feet, shower clogs, bathing suits, halter tops, or hair curlers

Individual not wearing a shirt or blouse

Hats (military/civilian, male/female) will be removed upon entry into the dining facility
