GOVERNMENT-INDUSTRY DATA EXCHANGE PROGRAM (GIDEP)

This regulation and AFR 800-20 provide for the exchange of data between Air Force Systems Command (AFSC) and Air Force Logistics Command (AFLC) activities and GIDEP. This regulation supports the Air Force Reliability and Maintainability Program, the Air Force Defective Parts and Components Control Program (DPCCP), and the Diminishing Manufacturing Sources and Material Shortages (DMSMS) Program. It applies to AFSC and AFLC activities involved in acquisition, contracting, manufacturing, research and development, modification, reliability, quality assurance, and logistics management of systems or equipment.

1. Program Description. GIDEP is operated and funded under a charter issued by the joint logistics commanders (JLC). It is a centralized, automated, data dissemination, storage, and retrieval program. This program promotes the free and voluntary interchange of parts data among Department of Defense (DOD), other government agencies, and industry parts users. It provides the Centralized Data Bank that supports the DPCCP in the data exchange functions. Other data banks, operated and maintained by GIDEP, provide information on calibration, electronic tests, failure rates, diminishing manufacturing sources and material shortages. The charter establishes the GIDEP Operations Center, under the program direction of the Naval Material Command, at the Fleet Analysis Center, Corona CA 91720.

2. HQ USAF Assigned Duties. The Acquisition Logistics and Communications Group (HQ USAF/LEYE) is the Air Staff office of primary responsibility. HQ USAF/LEYE:

- a. Gives policy guidance to the Air Force on how to put GIDEP into effect.
- b. Monitors the effectiveness of GIDEP through staff surveillance.

3. Joint AFSC and AFLC Assigned Duties. AFSC and AFLC must implement GIDEP, and:

- a. Provide representatives to the Government Advisory Group of GIDEP.
- b. Provide subordinate activities with policy and administrative direction, for active participation in GIDEP.
- c. Prepare and maintain joint implementing regulations, including instructions for preparing and processing data exchange with GIDEP.

4. Reporting Requirements. Reports and data are exchanged between AFSC and AFLC organizations and GIDEP. Use of the following forms is authorized, under

report control symbol (RCS) GIDEP 5200-1, for this exchange:

a. **DD Form 1938, Government-Industry Data Exchange Program ALERT.** This form is filled out and sent by a GIDEP participant to all other participants, to tell them of a defective part, component, or material.

b. **DD Form 1999, Test Report Summary Sheet.** MIL-STD-831 describes the format and content criteria that is used to prepare test reports. AFSC and AFLC laboratories, centers, and engineering offices prepare test report summary sheets, to transfer technical test data reports to GIDEP.

c. **DD Form 2000, General Report Summary Sheet.** This form is used to summarize general type reports and studies. It is included with the reports and studies when sent to GIDEP. Also, it is used to summarize responses to a DD Form 2002, Urgent Data Request, describing a diminishing source situation (see e below).

d. **DD Form 2001, GIDEP Failure Rate Data Summary.** This form lists failure rate, failure mode, and test background data on electrical and mechanical parts, for transmittal to GIDEP.

e. **DD Form 2002, Urgent Data Request.** This form is an informal request from any GIDEP participant to all other participants, to furnish technical data on a specific part or material. It is used to advise GIDEP participants that a manufacturer has ceased or is ceasing production on a specific item or component, or that a material shortage exists or is imminent. AFSC and AFLC GIDEP coordinators prepare DD Form 2002, as necessary, to query GIDEP participants for technical data and to respond to DD Forms 2002 sent by other participants.

5. Documentation Disposition. Dispose of documentation according to AFM 12-50.

6. Forms Prescribed and Implemented (Paragraph 4):

- a. DD Form 1938 (implemented).
- b. DD Forms 1999, 2000, 2001, and 2002 (prescribed).
