This change expands the missile badge award criteria to include 21M and 2W as AFSCs eligible for award of the missile badge (table 2, rule 9 and note 3). NOTES:

1. If both the command and control and weapons director badges have been earned, subsequent levels can be earned toward one badge only.
2. Director of Operations, HQ Air Force Space Command approves qualifying space operations specialties for sister and allied service members and wear authorization for allied service members. Army and Navy Space Commands approve wear authorization for their respective service members.

3. Guidelines for wear of the Space/Missile Badge and Missile Badge with Operations Designator.

3.1. The Space/Missile Badge is worn by all officers in the 13A and 13S Career Fields. Additionally, the Missile Badge with Operations Designator is worn by officers who have served or are serving, in the Missile Operations area (13SXC).

3.2. Subsequent levels of the Space/Missile Badge are earned while serving in the 13AX or 13SX AFSC, or while serving as a Space or Missile Wing/Operations Group Commander or deputy.

3.3. Higher levels of the Missile Badge can only be earned while serving in the subsequent 13SXC or 13S4 AFSC, or while serving as a Missile Wing/Operations Group Commander or deputy.

3.4. USCINCSpace, USCINCSSTRAT, and AFSPC/CC are authorized wear of the Master Space/Missile Badge upon assumption of their position. USCINCSSTRAT and AFSPC/CC are authorized wear of the Master Missile Badge with Operations Designator upon assumption of their position. Not authorized for wear when no longer holding these positions unless it was previously earned.

4. Officers in AFSC 20, Logistics Commander, 21LX, Logistician, and 30, Support Commander, wear the highest badge the individual was awarded in the Logistics or Support career areas. If the individual was not awarded a Logistics or Support badge, wear the highest badge they were awarded from the previous career area.

5. Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) members wear the EOD badge.

6. Effective 1 November 1996, officers in AFSCs 37AX (Information Management), integrated into the Chief, Mission Support; Personnel career field (36XX), wear the Manpower and Personnel badge at the same level (basic, senior, master) as worn on previous 37AX badge. Additionally, officers in AFSC 37XX, who crossflowed into 36XX prior to 1 November 1996, may use that time to upgrade to the next higher-level badge in accordance with paragraph 5.2.

★7. To qualify for the missile badge, individuals must have met all criteria outlined in paragraph 5, met time requirements in its entirety, to include the following:

★7.1. Munitions and Missile Maintenance Officers who do not attend Missile Maintenance Officers course, must directly supervise 2M/2W personnel in maintenance, loading or unloading of guided missiles or missile systems for a period of 12 months after completion of Munitions Maintenance Officers course in order to wear the basic badge. Subsequent levels will be IAW paragraph 5.

★7.2. 2W personnel must directly work with guided missiles or missile systems for a period of 12 months after completion of technical training school in order to wear the basic badge. Subsequent levels will be IAW paragraph 5.
