**SUMMARY OF REVISIONS**

**This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.**

**1. Mission.** Air Force Space Command (AFSPC) supports all military Services and combatant commands with space forces to control and exploit space on a global basis and in defense of the United States and its interests. AFSPC organizes, trains, and equips Air Force space and intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) forces for space control, force application, force enhancement and space support. This organization is a major command of the US Air Force.

**2. Command.**

- 2.1. The AFSPC commander will respond to the Chief of Staff of the Air Force for administration of space and ICBM forces.
- 2.2. The 14AF commander will provide, plan and execute forces and exercise OPCON as a component of the United States Space Command (USSPACECOM).
- 2.3. The 20AF commander will provide forces and exercise OPCON as a component of the United States Strategic Command (USSTRATCOM) for ICBM forces.

**3. Responsibilities.** AFSPC will:

- 3.1. Organize, train, and equip Air Force space and ICBM forces.
- 3.2. Provide space forces for USSPACECOM to perform space control, force application, force enhancement, and space support.
- 3.3. Provide ICBM forces for USSTRATCOM to perform force application.

- 3.4. Advocate, support acquisition, and perform operational test of new or improved weapon systems and equipment.
- 3.5. Manage the payloads of designated military satellites.
- 3.6. Communicate its mission and provide support to all military services and combatant commands.
- 3.7. Serve as gaining MAJCOM for assigned Air Force Reserve and Air National Guard forces. Assist with mobilizing or recalling these forces to active duty for assignment to duty as authorized by HAF.
