AFI 51-202, 7 Nov 03, is supplemented as follows:

This supplement implements AFD 51-2, *Military Justice*. It expands on the guidance provided in the Air Force instruction. This supplement does not apply to the US Air Force Reserve and the Air National Guard units and members.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This supplement supersedes AFI 51-202/AFMCS1, 16 Oct 01 and provides updated information.

2.2.11. (Added) Within 30 days following the assumption of command, commanders will be briefed by staff judge advocates concerning the provisions of this instruction and local processing procedures and standards.

2.7.1.1. (Added) The powers of the Commander, AFMC, under Article 15, UCMJ, are delegated to the Vice Commander, AFMC.

2.10.1. (Added) AFMC/CC has withheld the authority to impose nonjudicial punishment against officers from all officers in AFMC below the grade of brigadier general who are not general court-martial convening authorities.

3.3.3. (Added) The commander initiating the nonjudicial punishment action will explain any delay beyond 10 days in the remarks section of the Report on Individual Personnel.

4.4.1. (Added) The power of the Commander, AFMC, to act on appeals of nonjudicial punishment is delegated to the Vice Commander, AFMC.
