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**SUMMARY OF REVISIONS**

**This publication has been significantly revised and must be completely reviewed.**

1.10.4. (Added) For Air Force Reserve Command tenant units, the Installation Commander is defined as the senior Reserve officer.

1.10.5. (Added) Ensures the Combat Arms (CA) facility remains open to provide training during wing/base/squadron exercises or ceremonies.

1.11.3.1.1. (Added) The need for initial base line blood test and/or required annual test will be determined by the local Occupational Health Working Group (OHWG).

1.11.3.3.1. (Added) The need for pre-placement, annual and termination audiometric testing will be determined IAW AFOSH Standard 48-19, Hazardous Noise, AFI 48-20, Hearing Conservation and the local OHWG.

1.11.4. Provides two pair of prescription protective shooting glasses, to each AFSC 3P0X1B or SEI 312 qualified individual assigned to the Combat Arms section. One pair will be made of shatter-resistant glass or plastic meeting or exceeding MIL-S-44366a, military specifications for fragmentation or ANSI-Z87.1

safety standards. Lens size for prescription glasses are a minimum of 62mm X 54 ½ mm. Non-prescription glasses will meet the minimum size requirement of prescription glasses. Replacement prescription glasses will be furnished as needed due to breakage, excessive scratching of the lenses or change of prescription. Non-prescription shooting glasses will be issued by the unit.

1.14.10. Provide expenditure data by amount expended, caliber, type, Department of Defense Identification Code (DODIC), and National Stock Number (NSN). Provide a separate breakout of all simulated rounds fired on firearms simulators and report those by type (M16 rifle, M9 handgun, etc). Provide AFRC/SFXT with expenditure data for the fiscal quarter not later than 15 Jan, 15 Apr, 15 Jul, 15 Oct.

1.14.10.1. (Added) Submit AFRC Combat Arms Training Report to HQ AFRC/SFXT on a quarterly basis not later than 15 Jan, 15 Apr, 15 Jul, and 15 Oct.

1.14.15. Ensures all requests for deviations, waivers, or extensions are routed through HQ AFRC/SFXT and information copies are sent to applicable NAF/SF.

2.6.3. (Added) Firearms simulators may be used to conduct all practice orders of fire for Group A, B, and C if the CA section has access to a firearms simulator. Units having constraints in either range or munitions availability utilize the firearms simulators IAW table 2.2 to qualify Group B or C personnel. Units notify HQ AFRC/SFXT when sending in their quarterly munitions reports.

2.7.1.2. The definition of Security Forces includes officers, enlisted, Air Reserve Technicians, and the non-ART civilian force personnel whose duties include maintaining the security of the installation.

2.12.5. Practice and qualification must be completed not later than one Unit Training Assembly (UTA) or 30 days whichever is longer after the completion of mechanical and pre-marksanship training.

2.15.2. Ensure an informational copy is sent to the applicable NAF/SF section.

3.3.6.1. (Added) Follow-up evaluations for AFRC assigned instructors must be given not later than 60 days or two Unit Training Assemblies (UTAs), whichever is longer.

4.11.1. Use the AF Form 710, as a class roster and record of individual qualification for the firearms simulator weapons training. In the lot number block, write N/A. In the butt number/serial number block, enter the serial number or weapon number of the simulator weapon used. In the rounds used block, write the number of simulated rounds fired. Instructors ensure they are not listed as both a student and lead instructor on a single AF Form 710. A separate AF Form 710 must be completed if necessary.

4.11.2.1. (Added) Use the AF Form 522 to record course of fire, score, qualification status, and other information about an individual's weapons qualification using the firearms simulator. In the "Rounds Fired" block write in the number of rounds fired and SIM or CATS.

5.2.7. Combat Arms NCOICs will develop a local OI that deals specifically with the issues of transportation of munitions and weapons to off base training locations.

5.3.1.1. Send information copy to applicable NAF/SF.

5.4.11.4. To ensure trainees are able to quickly identify range officials performing block officer duties during range operation, AFRC recommends a red hat with "Combat Arms" in black letters across the front. The letters should be block style, not to exceed one inch in diameter.

5.9. **Range Closures.** Send information copy to applicable NAF/SF.
