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SECURITY FORCES SQUADRON/FLIGHT

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This mission directive prescribes the mission, organization, and responsibilities for an Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) security forces squadron/flight (SFS/SFF).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

It complies with HQ USAF PAD 02-05 direction to establish the combat wing organization structure.

1. Mission:

1.1. Peacetime Tenant Unit. Organizes, trains and equips unit type codes (UTCs) to perform Deployed Operational Capability (DOC) statement specified mission according to gaining major command (GMAJCOM) standards. Supports other AFRC readiness and exercise requirements as directed.

1.2. Peacetime Associate Unit. Organizes UTCs to GMAJCOM standards for in-place generation in order to integrate with and support the host unit. All mission training and equipping is the responsibility of the active duty host unit. Supports other AFRC readiness and exercise requirements and activities as directed. Associate and host SFS leaders share responsibility for ensuring readiness, including duty position qualification and core tasks outlined in AFI 36-225, in accordance with (IAW) established memoranda.

1.3. Peacetime AFRC Installation. Protects the Air Force combat capability of assigned forces and provides force protection at AFRC host base locations. Develops, maintains and manages the following programs: installation security, police services, crime prevention and combat arms.

1.4. Wartime All Units. Provides qualified Security Forces UTCs and personnel trained and equipped IAW the unit's DOC Statement.

2. Command. The commander or chief, SFS, reports directly to the Mission Support Group (MSG) or Regional Support Group (RSG) to which assigned. Applicability is shown at [Attachment 1](#).

3. Assigned Forces. While in peacetime status and during annual training, the SFS/SFF is under the direct control and supervision of the Mission Support Group commander or Regional Support Group commander to which assigned. Under Presidential call-up pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 12304, administrative jurisdiction remains unchanged. Operational control transfers to the commander of the gaining command. Under mobilization authority, command jurisdiction transfers to the commander of the unit to which assigned by the gaining command.

4. Relationships to Other Units. Established command channels apply.

Attachment 2**FUNCTIONAL STATEMENTS FOR THE SECURITY FORCES**

A2.1. Commander (CC). Responsible for the overall command, direction, planning, staff supervision, and management of the squadron. Provides for the administration, medical care, housing, discipline, and welfare of assigned personnel.

A2.2. Orderly Room (CCQ). Maintains files and records pertaining to readiness, discipline and professional development of assigned unit personnel.

A2.3. Security Forces Manager (SFM). Provides senior enlisted leadership for the unit. Evaluates Security Forces functional mission performance.

A2.4. Administration and Reports (SFA). Provides reports and analysis and administers the personnel, information and industrial security programs for the wing.

A2.5. Training and Resources (SFT). Manages resources and information management systems for the Security Forces unit. Provides combat arms and administers unit training.

A2.6. Force Protection Operations (SFO): Provides weapons system security, police services, confinement, and investigative functions for the wing. Maintains operational control of alpha flights.
