This directive states the mission and establishes the responsibilities for Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) combat logistics support squadrons (CLSS).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision updates terminology (paragraph **A1.3.**) and deletes previous paragraph 5, special instructions. A bar (|) indicates revision from the previous edition.

1. Mission:

- 1.1. Peacetime. The mission of the CLSS is to train to a level of readiness sufficient to assure that deployable teams can adequately meet the wartime commitments.
- 1.2. Wartime Emergencies. Governed by gaining command directives.

2. Command. The peacetime structure of the CLSS maintains effective training operations with the most cost-effective expenditure of resources and minimizes organizational turbulence upon wartime mobilization. CLSS functionally align for structural compatibility with active duty counterparts. Functional statements, applicability, and organizational structure are in **Attachment 1**, **Attachment 2**, and **Attachment 3**.

3. Assigned Forces. While in peacetime status and during 2 weeks of annual training, the CLSS is under the direct control and supervision of the logistics group/regional support group to which assigned. For all training deployments, reference AFRCI 10-204, *Air Force Reserve Exercise and Deployment Program*. Under a Presidential call-up issued pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 12304, partial mobilization, administrative jurisdiction remains unchanged. Operational control transfers to the commander of the gaining command. Under mobilization authority, command jurisdiction transfers to the commander of the unit to which assigned by the gaining command.

4. Relationships to Other Units. Established command channels apply. Communicate directly with the active duty advisory unit/active duty advisors and host Air Logistic Center on matters relating to training, inspection, and safety. Send a copy of such correspondence to the numbered Air Force (NAF) to which assigned.

Attachment 1**FUNCTIONAL STATEMENTS FOR COMBAT LOGISTICS SUPPORT
SQUADRONS**

A1.1. COMMAND. Responsible for the overall command, direction, planning, staff supervision, mobility preparation, and management for the squadron in the fulfillment of its mission to train and maintain highly qualified teams of specialists to perform aircraft battle damage repair, engineering assistance for recovery, heavy maintenance tasks, wartime supply support augmentation, packaging, and transportation support augmentation.

A1.2. MAINTENANCE FLIGHT. Conducts hands-on training in aircraft maintenance for reserve unit personnel. CLSS personnel are assigned to duties and supervised by the industrial production organization (e.g. F-16 Production Division for performance of periodic depot-level maintenance tasks on aircraft undergoing PDM). The maintenance Flight Chief has primary responsibility for scheduling and controlling maintenance training programs. Maintains assigned material, tools, and equipment.

A1.3. DISTRIBUTION FLIGHT. Provides and conducts training for a full range of skill levels for assigned supply/transportation personnel. Trains in duties and responsibilities to include the standard base supply system, rapid area distribution support, and the depot distribution system. Responsible for manufacturing specialized containers, cargo packaging, and ground handling training to prepare personnel for augmentation at wartime operating locations. Ensures personnel are prepared for mobilization according to the applicable unit type code.

A1.4. MISSION SUPPORT FLIGHT. Provides mobility and associated administrative services to the squadron commander for assigned personnel. Monitors unit readiness status and implements programs to assure preparedness for mobilization, contingencies and wartime emergencies. Provides administrative services to assigned/attached personnel such as temporary duty, career development, reenlistments, and promotions. Provides personnel support and data updates to the automated data processing system.

A1.5. TRAINING FLIGHT. Provides for and conducts the training of a full range of skill levels for aircraft maintenance, supply, and transportation personnel assigned to the unit. Responsible for the explicit management of duties and responsibilities involving on-the-job training for aircraft maintenance (to include depot-level tasks), aircraft battle damage repair, supply, transportation and assigned technician skill acquisition and proficiency.
