This mission directive prescribes the mission and establishes the responsibilities for Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) maintenance squadrons (MXS).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision reassigns the MXS to the maintenance group to comply with HQ USAF PAD 02-05, *CSAF Direction to Establish a New Combat Wing Organization Structure* (paragraph **1.1.**); updates unit location (**Attachment 1**); and adds organizational chart (**Attachment 2**). A bar (|) indicates a revision from the previous edition.

1. Mission:

1.1. Peacetime. The mission of MXS is to train to provide a level of readiness sufficient to perform organization and intermediate level maintenance on unit assigned aircraft, engines, weapons, and related aerospace ground equipment. MXS are also tasked to provide a trained mobility maintenance force for post mobilization tasking.

1.2. Wartime/Emergencies. Governed by gaining command directives upon mobilization.

2. Command. MXS are assigned to AFRC Maintenance and air control groups. Their peacetime structure maintains effective operations and training with the least expenditure of resources and minimizes organizational turbulence upon wartime mobilization. MXS functionally align for structural compatibility with their active duty counterparts. Those units whose size prohibits expanding to an equipment maintenance squadron/component maintenance squadron (EMS/CMS) configuration to match active duty counterparts will structure as an MXS.

3. Assigned Forces. While in peacetime status and during two weeks of annual training, MXS are under the direct control and supervision of the AFRC group to which assigned. Under Presidential call-up pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 12304, administrative jurisdiction remains unchanged. Operational control trans-

fers to the commander of the gaining command. Under mobilization authority, command jurisdiction transfers to the commander of the unit to which assigned by the gaining command.

4. Relationship to Other Units. Established command channels apply. Communicate directly with the active duty advisory unit/active duty advisors on matters relating to training, inspection, and safety. Send a copy of such correspondence to the respective unit to which assigned.
