This mission directive prescribes the mission, organization, and responsibilities for the Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) civil engineer squadrons/flights (CES/CEF).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision reassigns CES/CEF from support group to mission support groups in compliance with HQ USAF PAD 02-05, CSAF Direction to Establish a New Combat Wing Organization Structure. Peacetime mission, ([Attachment 1](#)), Applicability, and ([Attachment 2](#)), Organizational Chart, updated to reflect current organizational structure. A bar (|) indicates revisions from previous edition.

1. Mission:

1.1. Peacetime. The mission of the CES/CEF is to train to provide a level of readiness sufficient to assure the mobile Prime Base Engineer Emergency Force (Prime BEEF) including Rapid Engineer Deployable Heavy Operational Repair Squadron, Engineer (RED HORSE), Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD), Civil Engineer Inspection, Maintenance, and Repair Team (CEMIRT), Staff Augmentation Team, Disaster Preparedness High Threat Augmentation Team, and Fire Fighters Teams can adequately meet the wartime commitments pursuant to the appropriate operations plan and designed operational capability.

1.2. Wartime. Governed by gaining command directives upon mobilization.

2. Command. The commander, CES/CEF, reports directly to the mission support group or regional support group commander to which assigned. Their peacetime structure design maintains effective operations with the least expenditure of resources and minimizes organizational turbulence upon wartime mobilization. The CES/CEF is aligned for structural compatibility with active duty counterparts.

3. Assigned Forces. While in peacetime status and during 2 weeks of annual training, the CES/CEF is under the direct control and supervision of the group commander to which assigned. Under Presidential

call-up pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 12304, administrative jurisdiction remains unchanged. Operational control transfers to the commander of the gaining command. Under mobilization authority, command jurisdiction transfers to the commander of the unit to which assigned by the gaining command.

4. Relationships to Other Units. Established command channels apply. Communicate directly with the gaining command representatives on matters relating to operational training, inspection, operational mission coordination, and logistics support. Send copy of correspondence documenting such coordination to the appropriate Numbered Air Force (NAF) and HQ AFRC functional managers.
