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SERVICES SQUADRONS/FLIGHTS

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This mission directive states the mission and establishes the responsibilities for Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) Services squadrons/flights (SVS/SVF).

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision reassigns SVS/SVF from support group to mission support groups in compliance with HQ USAF PAD 02-05, CSAF Direction to Establish a New Combat Wing Organization Structure. Updates peacetime mission, Command, Assigned Forces, Applicability to reflect the unit designations as squadrons or flights (**Attachment 1**), and Organizational Chart, updated to reflect current organizational structure (**Attachment 2**). A bar (|) indicates revision from the previous edition.

1. Mission:

1.1. **Peacetime.** The mission of SVS/SVF is to formulate plans, establish procedures for, and direct the Services programs at AFRC bases. The SVS/SVF operates and maintain Services support functions and facilities for assigned wing/group personnel. Responsible for management and training of assigned Prime Readiness in Base Services (RIBS) teams.

1.2. **Wartime/Emergencies.** Governed by gaining command directives.

2. Command. The SVS/SVF reports directly to the Mission Support Group Commander. The peacetime structure of AFRC SVS/SVF design maintains effective operations with the least expenditure of resources and minimizes organizational turbulence upon wartime mobilization. These squadrons/flights functionally align for structural compatibility with their active duty counterparts.

3. Assigned Forces. While in peacetime status and during 2 weeks of annual training, SVS/SVF are under the direct control and supervision of the AFRC Mission Support Group to which assigned. Under Presidential call-up pursuant to Title 10 U.S.C. 12304, administrative jurisdiction remains unchanged.

Operational control transfers to the commander of the gaining command. Under mobilization authority, command jurisdiction transfers to the commander of the unit to which assigned by the gaining command.

4. Relationship to Other Units. Established command channels apply. Communicates directly with the active duty advisory unit/active duty advisors on matters relating to training, inspection, and safety. Send copy of such correspondence to the respective unit to which assigned.
