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The OPR for this supplement is HQ AFSPC/JA (Maj Robert Smith). This supplement implements and extends the guidance of Air Force Instruction (AFI) 51-202, *Nonjudicial Punishment*. The AFI is published word-for-word without editorial review. Air Force Space Command (AFSPC) supplemental material is indicated in bold face. This supplement describes AFSPC's procedures for use in conjunction with the basic AFI. It applies to Headquarters Air Force Space Command (AFSPC), its subordinate units, and to all organizations who receive support from HQ AFSPC/JA offices. It does not apply to Air Force Reserve Command nor Air National Guard units. Upon receipt of this integrated supplement, discard the Air Force basic publication.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This revision delegates the powers under Article 15, UCMJ, of the Commander, AFSPC to the Vice Commander, and deletes the requirement for commanders below the grade of O-7 from coordinating with AFSPC/CC before imposing nonjudicial punishment upon a commissioned officer. A bar (|) indicates revisions from previous edition.

2.3. The powers of the Commander, AFSPC, are delegated to the Vice Commander, AFSPC.

3.2. If nonjudicial punishment is initiated more than 10 calendar days after the case ready date, the commander will include a brief explanation of the delay on the Report of Individual Personnel (RIP), which will be forwarded by the servicing staff judge advocate along with the nonjudicial punishment record to the staff judge advocate of the officer exercising general court-martial jurisdiction of the installation.

4.8. If the AFSPC Commander or Vice Commander would be imposing punishment and the AFSPC Commander or Vice Commander are not located on the same installation as the alleged offender, the alleged offender appears personally before the senior commander assigned to AFSPC on the same installation with the alleged offender. This senior commander prepares a memorandum summarizing the presentation. All documents will be forwarded to HQ AFSPC/JA through the legal office which supports the installation to which the offender is assigned.

7.3. The powers of the Commander, AFSPC, are delegated to the Vice Commander, AFSPC.
