AFI 36-2903, 1 November 2001, is supplemented as follows. This publication applies to AMC, AMC-gained Air National Guard (ANG) units upon mobilization and when published in ANGIND 2, and Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) units and tenants units located on AMC host installations. Authority to publish is HQ AFPC/DPSFC Memorandum, 18 June 1997. **The OPR for this supplement is HQAMC/DPFMS (TSgt Davis).** The purpose of this supplement is to continue the process of forming one mobility culture. The changes to aircrew flight uniforms comprise elements from various backgrounds to simplify their wear within AMC. The transition to cloth sewn-on rank on the flight suit is an enhancement to safety in and around our aircraft in lieu of rank being attached by velcro and standardizes the wear of rank insignia. These changes also bring something from each of the individual cultures that have formed AMC. The use of the name or mark of any specific manufacturer, commercial product, commodity, or service in this publication does not imply endorsement by the Air Force.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This interim change (IC) 02-01 verifies that the new AFI 36-2903, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel*, 1 November 2001 does not affect the content of the existing supplement. This IC changes the purpose statement to reflect the date of the new basic. The date of the supplement has changed and **Attachment 10 (Added)** has been added.

Table 1.1. Commanders Responsibilities.

<p>Installation Commanders</p>	<p>May authorize the wear of organizational and functional clothing as prescribed in accordance with (IAW) Attachment 9 (Added) of this supplement and Allowance Standard (AS) 016, <i>Special Purpose Clothing and Personal Equipment</i>. Authorized clothing and wear requirements will be listed in the base supplement.</p> <p>Military personnel assigned full-time duties in officer and NCO club facilities, recreation centers, youth centers, bowling centers, golf courses, recreation workshops, and sports facilities are authorized the optional wear of civilian clothing while performing military duties. The services officer will define, in writing, the type (blazers, trousers, shirts, coveralls, etc.), style limitations, etc., of authorized civilian clothing approved by the installation commander. In all cases, a name tag with grade is worn to identify the individual and/or position. On-duty military personnel will wear the specified civilian dress or they will be in appropriate military uniform. Members must still adhere to grooming standards IAW AFI 36-2903. The name tag and clothing will be standardized by facility.</p> <p>Table 1.1 (Added). Military personnel assigned full-time duties in Health and Wellness Centers (HAWC) are authorized the optional wear of civilian clothing while performing military duties within the HAWC mobile wellness centers. The HAWC director/health promotion manager will define, in writing, the type (polo shirts, shorts, jackets, warm-up suits, hats, etc.), style limitations, etc., of authorized civilian clothing approved by the installation commander. In all cases, a name tag with grade is worn to identify the individual and/or position. On-duty military personnel will wear the specified civilian dress or they will be in appropriate military uniform. Members must still adhere to grooming standards IAW AFI 36-2903. The name tag and clothing will be standardized by facility.</p> <p>The Security Forces Bicycle Patrol uniform and wear instructions are authorized for wear IAW AMCI 31-201, <i>Bicycle Patrol Program</i>.</p>

Note 4. Command or unit emblems are not authorized to be worn.

Note 2. Officers may wear bright nonsubdued metal grade insignia on BDU caps while in garrison.

Note 3. When wearing the BDU shirt or jacket configured with USAF/Name Tapes, all AMC personnel will wear a subdued sewn-on AMC command patch (mandatory wear date, 1 Oct 97). The patch will be attached to right breast pocket, centered between left and right edges, between bottom of flap and bottom of pocket. Installation commanders may approve wear of one subdued sewn-on organizational patch (wing or squadron). Organizational patches will be between 3 and 3 1/2 inches. The organizational patch will be attached to the left breast pocket, centered between left and right edges, between bottom of flap and bottom of pocket. If the member has an awarded duty badge (e.g., security forces or fire protection), then the organizational patch is not worn. If the member has an awarded badge that would be worn on the left breast pocket (e.g., missile badge), then the patch or badge is worn. Morale patches are not authorized to be worn on the BDU. Morale patches include, but are not limited to specialty, competition, or recognition patches such as PRIME BEEF, PRIME RIB, Disaster Preparedness Response Force, Life Support, Top Dollar, Rodeo, Readiness Challenge, the Daedalian Award, and Hennessy Award. (Therefore, no patches are authorized to be worn above the name tape on the BDU.) (**NOTE:** For Maternity BDU place patches in same relative position.)

Table 2.2.

Line 6. A list of all installation commander authorized organizational baseball caps will be listed in an attachment to the installation's supplement for dress and personal appearance.

Line 11. The wear of black crewneck undershirts, long-sleeved black or brown turtlenecks, dickies, or thermal undershirts without pockets is authorized.

Line 12. Patches will be sewn-on the BDU.

Line 13. Functional clothing authorized for wear with the BDU, will be worn IAW AFI 36-2903, Chapter 3, paragraphs 3.1 through 3.1.2, **Attachment 9 (Added)** of this supplement, and AS 016.

Table 2.4.

Line 9. A list of all authorized organizational baseball caps will be listed in an attachment to the installation's supplement for dress and personal appearance.

Line 14. The wear of black crewneck undershirts, long-sleeved black or brown turtlenecks, dickies or thermal undershirts without pockets is authorized.

Line 15. Patches will be sewn-on the Maternity BDU or BDU.

Line 16. Functional clothing authorized for wear with the BDU, will be worn IAW AFI 36-2903, Chapter 3, paragraphs 3.1 through 3.1.2, **Attachment 9 (Added)** of this supplement, and AS 016.

3.1. Worn IAW **Attachment 9 (Added)** of this supplement and AS 016.

3.1.2.1. (Added) Military personnel assigned to the 89th Transportation Executive Driver Branch as drivers are authorized to wear gray slacks, blue blazers, white shirts as issued under AS 016. This uniform may be worn to any on-base office or off-base duty-related activity.

3.1.2.2. (Added) This supplement, **Attachment 5 (Added)**, prescribes wear of the flight uniform. AS 016 establishes the maximum flying/equipment requirements for aircrew members. Organizational commanders or their representatives will determine the optimum number of items and quantities desired for their personnel within the limits of AS 016. This determination will be a coordinated effort between representatives of the individual equipment unit (IEU) and the requesting organizational commander. A list of the required quantities of flying clothing/equipment items will be furnished to the IEU, attached to AF Form 601, **Equipment Action Request**, or letter, and signed by the organizational commander. Additions/deletions will be submitted to IEU, as required.

3.1.2.3. (Added) AMC commanders at non-AMC bases will request the host installation commander to authorize AMC aircrew members to wear the flight uniforms IAW **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement.

3.1.2.4. (Added) Aircrew members authorized special articles of clothing under an allowance standard will wear the uniform prescribed by the local unit commander and recommended for the type of mission performed. The above is applicable to all AMC units except the 89 AW, 1 AS, and 99 AS. Their uniform will be determined by **Attachment 5 (Added)** and **Attachment 8 (Added)** of this supplement and their appropriate commanders. AFRC personnel assigned to AMC will wear the AMC-prescribed uniform while in training status. This supplement's **Attachment 5 (Added)** and **Attachment 8 (Added)** depict placement of badges, insignia, etc.

3.1.2.5. (Added) Flight Attendant's Uniform. **Attachment 8 (Added)** of this supplement prescribes the AMC flight attendant's uniform. This is the only uniform authorized for flight attendant's wear on 89 AW, 1 AS, and 99 AS missions. Its wear away from place of duty is the same as that for the BDU. This uniform may be worn to any on-base office or activity and during pre-mission and post-mission duties.

3.1.2.6. (Added) **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement prescribes wear instructions of functional clothing and other commonly used functional clothing items and equipment.

Table 3.4.

Security Forces Cold Weather Jacket, Shade 1157 (CWU 46-P) or YAAC-89-3. Officers wear grade insignia 5/8 inches from edge and centered on the epaulet. An American flag emblem with a gold border portraying straight flag, not a waving flag, will be worn on the left sleeve shoulder by all active duty security forces personnel. (Flag will not be worn on the new improved jacket to prevent damaging the water-resistant material.) AMC-gained AFRC and ANG SFs will comply with AFI 36-2903/AFRC or ANG Supplement.

Note 6. Approval authority for base entry controllers is delegated to the installation commander. Specific clothing requirements should be based on post-assignment. Subdued command crests are authorized for wear with the BDU (the subdued crest will not be worn with any combination of blue uniform).

Table 3.6.

Transportation commanders may authorize AMC passenger service badges (blue with white lettering) for wear by 2T2X1 personnel while performing passenger service duties. Supervisory and management personnel will wear a red badge with white lettering. The badge will be a standard 3 1/2 by 2 1/2 inches.

Leather A-2 Flying Jacket. The AMC patch is a 3 1/2-inch standardized shield configuration embroidered on black simulated leather. The AMC emblem embroidered with "Air Mobility Command" blue lettering and gold border will be worn as soon as available through local supply channels but NLT 1 Jan 98. AMC-gained AFRC and ANG members will wear the AMC patch.

7.2.2. Upon the installation commanders' approval, all AMC base supplements will be processed IAW the guidelines contained in the basic instruction. All AMC base supplements will be sent to HQ AMC/DPPFQ for final approval.

Attachment 5 (Added)

WEAR INSTRUCTIONS FOR AIRCREW FLIGHT UNIFORMS

A5.1. (Added) Flight Suit. Individually issued fire retardant coveralls. Worn as appropriate for climatic conditions. Worn by aircrew members when engaged in flight duty. Flight duty includes preparation, flight, preflight, in-flight, post-flight, and other flightline duties associated with aircraft operations. Installation commanders may prescribe wear in the interest of morale, health, and welfare of their people. All aircrew members will have sleeves rolled down to the wrist at all times. All pockets will be zipped and all pocket items will remain concealed. (Exception: Pens and pencils may show when carried in the left sleeve or right leg pen holders.) Flight suits will be neat, clean, and properly worn, and are acceptable for wear in all base establishments. They may be worn off base to dine at local establishments frequented by civilian workers wearing work clothing comparable to the BDU, regardless of whether or not the establishment offers waiter and waitress service. Dining at establishments which require a more formal dress code than work clothing is prohibited (Notes 1 and 6).

A5.2. (Added) Flight Jacket, NOMEX. Worn IAW AS 016 and as appropriate for climatic conditions. Accouterments will be configured the same as the flight suit.

A5.3. (Added) Flight Cap. Worn as described in the basic instruction to this supplement. This cap will not be worn while wearing the Gortex Parka.

A5.4. (Added) Flight Gloves. Worn IAW AS 016 by all aircrew members. Helicopter aircrew members will wear while aircraft's engines are operating. They may be removed temporarily, if required, to perform specific tasks. The wearing of NOMEX gloves on fixed-wing aircraft is not mandatory, unless prescribed by other directives; however, flight crews will have NOMEX gloves in their possession during all phases of flight and wear them should environment and/or flight conditions dictate. Gloves will not be modified in any manner.

A5.5. (Added) Flying Helmets (Protective). Worn by aircrew members whose duties require their use and only during flight duties in and around the aircraft. Worn by all helicopter aircrew members while aircraft engines are operating.

A5.6. (Added) Footgear. Boots, jungle or combat as authorized in AS 016, and boots as described in the basic instruction. All-leather combat boots that lace above the ankle will be worn on all flights requiring parachutes, missions in a combat environment, when the potential exists for wear of chemical defense equipment, and by helicopter aircrew members engaged in flight duty. Lace-up zipper inserts may be used.

A5.7. (Added) Gortex Parka and Pants, Camouflage. May be worn by boom operators, loadmasters, and flight engineers only while performing flight duties in/around the immediate vicinity of their aircraft. Must be issued through local organizational channels and authorized for wear by the installation commander. This item will be worn IAW Chapter 3, paragraphs 3.1. and 3.1.2., of the basic instruction and AS 016. (Exception: Personnel will not sew or attach any item onto this parka that could damage its waterproof integrity.) Grade insignia will be worn IAW **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement unless safety requirements prohibit.

A5.8. (Added) Socks. Black; cotton, or wool.

A5.9. (Added) Stocking Cap. US Navy Watch Cap. Optional for wear by personnel subject to prolonged exposure to adverse weather only. Worn in accordance with **Attachment 5 (Added)**, this supplement.

A5.10. (Added) Undershirts or Turtlenecks. The wear of black or brown crewneck undershirts; long-sleeved black, brown, or NOMEX turtlenecks; dickies, or thermal undershirts without pockets is authorized.

A5.11. (Added) Rank Insignia/Officers. Subdued sewn-on cloth grade insignia will be worn on the shoulders of coveralls/flight jackets. Rank will be sewn on 5/8 inches from seam, centered on shoulder. This change is effective immediately to be completed by 1 Jan 98. (See photo at right.)

Figure A5.1. (Added) Rank Insignia/Officers.



A5.12. (Added) Squadron-Specific Cloth Name Patch. Officers and Enlisted. Installation commanders will approve all patches. Patch will be 2 by 4 inches and worn above the left breast pocket. Color will be taken from the squadron patch and standardized throughout the squadron. The patch will be attached with hook/pile tape shaped to the patch. (See patch 1) Unit logo or state emblem (ANG) may be displayed on the patch. (See patch 2) For officers, the first line will show: appropriate unit logo/state emblem and/or aviation badge; second line: first name, initials or legitimate nickname, and last name. For enlisted, the first line will show: appropriate unit logo/state emblem and/or aviation badge; second line: abbreviated rank, first name, initials or legitimate nickname, and last name. Enlisted personnel have the option to have a third line to accommodate placement of abbreviated rank (Note 3). (See photos at right.)

A5.13. (Added) Aircrew-Style Name Patch (ASNP) for Officers/Enlisted (Optional). Upon installation commander's approval personnel may wear the ASNP. Patch will be 2 by 4 inches, black leather with silver embossed lettering. The patch will be attached with hook/pile tape shaped to the patch. For officers, the first line will show: appropriate aviation badge; second line: first name, initials, or legitimate nickname, and last name; third line: abbreviated rank and USAF. For enlisted, the first line will show: appropriate aviation badge; second line: first name, initials, or legitimate nickname, and last name; third line: abbreviated rank and USAF (Note 3).

A5.14. (Added) AMC Emblem (High Visibility). The patch is 3 by 3 inches in size, centered above the right breast pocket, and attached with hook/pile tape shaped to the patch. The AMC emblem embroidered with “Air Mobility Command” blue lettering and gold border will be worn as soon as available through local supply channels but NLT 1 Jan 98 (Note 3). (See photo at right.)

A5.15. (Added) Add-On Patches (Optional). Only one may be worn at the top of AMC emblem by members who have been awarded the individual flying hour milestone award or currently are performing instructor duties.

A5.15.1. (Added) Accident-Free Patch (e.g., 1500/2,500/3,500/5,000/7,500/10,000/15,000/20,000 hours) (Optional). Patch is 1 3/4 by 3/4 inches with embroidered gold numerals on a blue background and with a gold embroidered border. Colors match the AMC emblem.

A5.15.2. (Added) Instructor Patch. Description same as the accident-free patch.

A5.16. (Added) Morale Patches. Are not authorized for wear on the flight suit, i.e., specialty, competition, or recognition patches.

A5.17. (Added) Unit/Service Insignia (High Visibility). Approved unit emblems. Size will not exceed 3 inches in diameter. Worn on the right sleeve shoulder and positioned no lower than 1 inch from the shoulder seam, attached with hook/pile tape (shaped to the patch is optional) (Notes 3 and 5). (See photo at right.)

Figure A5.5. (Added) Unit/Service Insignia.

A5.18. (Added) United States National Flag Emblem. American flag emblems with gold border portraying straight flag, not a waving flag. Size will be between 2 by 3 and 2 by 2 1/2 inches. Worn on the left sleeve shoulder with union to front and stripes trailing. Positioned no lower than 1 inch from shoulder seam, attached with hook/pile tape shaped to the flag. (See photo at right.)

Figure A5.6. (Added) United States National Flag Emblem.

A5.19. (Added) Organizational Scarves. Colors and patterns to be prescribed by the commander. Wing commanders may authorize wear of distinctive scarves by individual units. All scarves must be in good taste and standardized (size, method of wear, etc.) throughout the wing. Scarves will not be worn in the aircraft or in situations where wear is impractical or inappropriate. When issued and authorized for wear, scarves must be worn to off-base establishments.

A5.20. (Added) Instructor, Flight Examiner, Stan/Eval Flight Examiner Scroll (High Visibility). Color, pattern, and size to be prescribed by the commander. Wear of the scroll will be at discretion of the wing commander. The scroll is worn as an add-on patch at the top of the unit/service insignia (Note 4).

A5.21. (Added) Winter/Flyer's Hat. Optional for wear by personnel subject to prolonged exposure to adverse weather only.

NOTES:

1. (Added). 375 AW operational support aircraft and 89 AW aircrews are authorized to wear the distinctive jacket while performing flight duties. It may be worn with all service uniforms except service dress. Pin-on nonsubdued grade insignia will be worn on epaulets.
2. (Added). The 1 HS crew members may wear the VIP blue NOMEX flight suit/jacket for unit missions.
3. (Added). Patches will be attached with hook/pile tape. All attached hook/pile tape will be one color, either all black or green. Patches and hook/pile tape changes will be effective NLT 1 Jan 98.

Special Operations Forces involved in special operations training or aircrew on special operations missions may wear subdued accouterments to include name patch in place of high visibility accouterments.

4. (Added). An approved numbered air force patch may be worn in lieu of the unit insignia. The size, position, and attachment requirements are the same as the unit insignia.
5. (Added). The Weapons School patch (graduate or instructor) may be worn in lieu of the unit insignia upon completion of the appropriate school. The size, position, and attachment requirements are the same as the unit insignia.
6. (Added). Personnel assigned to the HQ AMC staff may configure their flight suits to their previously assigned unit standard or to the prescribed HQ AMC directorate configuration.

Attachment 6 (Added)**COMBAT CONTROL PERSONNEL UNIFORMS**

A6.1. (Added) Beret. Authorized for wear with all uniform combinations, except dress uniforms, by qualified personnel performing combat control duties.

A6.1.1. (Added) Scarlet Red Beret. Knitted wool outer shell, leather binding, scarlet red, with distinctive USAF combat control badge. Item described in AS 016. Authorization to wear the scarlet red beret requires satisfying the prerequisites for and performing duty as an officer or enlisted combat controller. The scarlet red beret and distinctive USAF Combat Control badge are awarded by the Combat Control School upon successful completion of the specialist course (1C231). The scarlet red beret is authorized for wear by combat control personnel IAW the basic instruction for this supplement. Officers will wear miniature rank insignia centered below the badge.

A6.2. (Added) Flight Clothing. As described in AS 016 and worn IAW this supplement, [Attachment 5 \(Added\)](#).

A6.3. (Added) Desert Camouflage Ensemble. Includes daytime hat, daytime coat, night parka and liner, and daytime trousers. Item described in AS 016. May be worn during contingencies, exercises, deployments, and tactical training requiring desert camouflage. Trousers are bloused and sleeves may be rolled up (Notes 1 and 2).

A6.4. (Added) Snow Camouflage Ensemble. Includes helmet cover, parka, trousers, and pack cover. Items described in AS 016. May be worn over other ensembles, when required, for maximum cover and concealment in hostile snow environments or during tactical training (Note 2).

A6.5. (Added) Extreme Cold Weather (ECW) Ensemble. Includes down/polyester insulated hood, mittens, jacket (parka), jacket liner, trousers, trouser liner, undershirt, and undershorts. Items described in AS 016. May be worn when required, for maximum protection in adverse environments or during tactical training. Not for garrison wear (Note 2).

A6.6. (Added) Jump Suit. Coveralls, cotton duck, color black or silver designed for free-fall parachutists. Item described in AS 016. May be worn while performing military free-fall parachute jumps. Not for garrison wear (Notes 1 and 2).

A6.7. (Added) Swimmer/Scuba Ensemble. May include swimsuit, hood, gloves/mittens, booties, coral boots, wet suit (trousers/jacket/shorty), or dry suit (in place of wet suit) as described in AS 016. Worn in conjunction with appropriate swimmer/scuba accessories for maximum protection in the water environment. Not for garrison wear (Note 2).

A6.8. (Added) Wool Shirt. Shirt, cold weather, wool nylon flannel, OG 108. May be worn as an outer or middle layer garment with other work ensembles or wool trousers consistent with requirements for environmental protection and proper cover and concealment. May only be worn as an outer garment in garrison with work ensembles. As outer garment, name patch is required (Note 1).

A6.9. (Added) Undershirt/T-shirt. Worn IAW the basic instruction for this supplement.

A6.10. (Added) Wool Trousers. Trousers, cold weather, wool serge, olive green. Item described in AS 016. May be worn as an outer garment or middle layer garment with other work ensembles or wool shirt consistent with requirements for environmental protection and proper cover and concealment. Not for garrison wear.

A6.11. (Added) Trunks, Swimmer's/Underwater Demolition Team (UDT). Boxer shorts, trunk, tan color, 50 percent cotton/50 percent polyester. Item described in AS 016. Worn in combination with brown or black T-shirt, running shoes with solid white socks or boots with black socks while performing physical training, parachuting, boat/swimming/scuba, and while in transit to and from, or in preparing for these activities. Speedo swim suit, navy blue or black, or athletic supporter (optional) will be worn under swimmer's trunks. Authorized headgear is organizational baseball cap. Wear will be consistent with environmental requirements. Not for garrison wear outside duty section (Note 3).

A6.12. (Added) Physical Training (PT) Ensemble. Warm-up suit, track shirt, running shorts, running shoes, socks. Nylon acrylic and cotton materials. Silver gray warm-up suit, black shorts, and silver gray shirt. A contrasting 4-inch combat control crest will be on the left chest of the jacket, track shirt, and on the left leg of the shorts. Socks will be solid white. Items described in AS 041, *EAID-Special Allowance*. May be worn while participating in PT, scuba, or parachuting and during transit to/from these activities. Running shoes are authorized only for PT. Not for garrison wear outside duty section.

A6.13. (Added) Jungle Boots. Boots, hot weather tropical, black leather and nylon. Items described in AS 016. Worn, as appropriate, for climatic and geographic conditions with ensembles, flight clothing, and UDT shorts. Authorized for garrison wear (Note 2).

A6.14. (Added) Mountain Boots. Safety boots designed for mountain operations, subdued color, LP item. Worn, as appropriate, for climatic/geographic conditions with ensembles suited for same conditions. Not for garrison wear.

A6.15. (Added) Field Boots. Safety boots designed for field operations, i.e., Herman Survivors, Chippewas, or Danners, subdued color, LP item. Worn, as appropriate, for climatic/geographic conditions with ensembles suited for same conditions. Authorized for garrison wear.

A6.16. (Added) Parachutist's Boots. Boots, parachutist, men's 9 inch, (soft) rubber heel and sole, leather upper, elastic front lacing, hinged, foam-cushioned, sole air pockets, color black. Item described in AS 016. May be worn while performing land parachute jumps. Not for garrison wear.

A6.17. (Added) Jump Boots. Boots, men's 10 inch, hard rubber heel and sole, leather upper, front lacing, plain or cap toe, color black. LP item. May be worn, as appropriate, for climatic and geographic conditions with ensembles suited for same conditions. Authorized for garrison wear.

A6.18. (Added) Specialized Clothing. Safety clothing designed for specific training and operations. Items "a" through "c" are LP items. Items "d" through "h" are described in AS 016. May be worn, as appropriate, for type training/operations and climatic/geographic conditions.

h. Helmet and liner.

NOTES:

1. (Added). The ASNP will be worn with the camouflage ensembles and wool shirt and may be worn with the jump suit.
2. (Added). Personnel are authorized to wear ensembles during mission preparation, alert duties, and when performing pararescue airborne and surface tasks. During flight, sleeves will be rolled down. When employment is probable during operational flights or planned during operational/training flights, pararescue personnel are authorized to wear the BDU, snow camouflage, ECW, tree suit, jump suit, or swimmer/scuba ensembles. NOMEX flight clothing will be worn when flying cross-country flights as an aircrew member, when employment is not probable, or whenever practical to afford maximum survivability should an accident occur. Jungle boots are authorized for wear during flying activities.
3. (Added). A standard subdued name tape (last name) will be worn centered on the right leg of the swimmer's trunks, 1/2 inch from the bottom edge. The desert camouflage hat may be worn when maximum sun protection is required. Airmen will not wear grade insignia on headgear. Officer grade insignia will be regular size subdued metal, centered vertically above the bill of the cap.

Attachment 7 (Added)**COMBAT CONTROL SELECTION TEAM UNIFORMS**

A7.1. (Added) Baseball Cap. Cap, polyester and mesh, adjustable-one size fits all, medium crown, large visor, color black. LP item. Worn with all athletic combinations listed in this attachment. Authorized for wear as part of a work uniform (Note 2).

A7.2. (Added) The following items may be worn as part of a work uniform for garrison duties (Notes 1 and 2).

A7.2.1. (Added) Coach's Shirt. Men's combination cotton polyester poplin, quarter length sleeves, white or black. LP item.

A7.2.2. (Added) Coach's Pants. Men's athletic warm-up type, elastic waist with button closure and zipper fly, material optional, color black. LP item.

A7.2.3. (Added) Coach's Shorts. Men's athletic warm-up type, elastic waist with button closure and zipper fly, material optional, color black. LP item.

A7.2.4. (Added) Coach's Jacket. Men's athletic warm-up type, single-breasted; type of neck, material and method of closure optional, color silver. LP item.

A7.2.5. (Added) Athletic Shoes. Men's athletic type, standard lacing; soles style and color optional. LP item.

A7.2.6. (Added) Socks. Socks, athletic type, material optional, color white. LP item.

A7.3. (Added) T-shirt. T-shirt, cotton/polyester gray, with combat control team logo on left side of chest and with the word "instructor" printed across the back over the shoulder blades. LP item (Note 2). May be worn in combination with running shorts while conducting and/or performing physical fitness evaluations or physical training and while transiting to and from these activities. Not for garrison wear.

A7.4. (Added) Running Shorts. Shorts, running, nylon, with small or combat control logo on left leg, color black--logo white. LP item (Note 2). May be worn in combination with T-shirt while conducting and/or performing physical fitness evaluations or physical training and while transiting to and from these activities. Not for garrison wear.

A7.5. (Added) Sweat Suit Ensemble. Includes sweat suit and pants, cotton/polyester, color black, with rank and name stenciled on front and "instructor" stenciled on back. Stenciling in white (Note 2). May be worn while conducting and/or performing physical fitness evaluations or physical training and while transiting to and from these activities.

NOTES:

1. (Added). Uniforms in this attachment are authorized for wear by combat control instructors. Combination of wear will be as directed by the OL commander, consistent with requirements for season/climatic conditions.
2. (Added). Markings for the baseball cap, coach's shirt, and jacket will be accomplished as outlined in the note. The coach's shirt will be marked with instructor's name over right breast and "Combat Control Instructor," on the left breast in script stitching. The coach's jacket will have "Combat

Control" on the back. The baseball cap will have a combat control logo in white centered on the front. All lettering will be 1 inch in size except for the jacket and T-shirt, which will be 4 inches. Embroidery and stencils will be white on black or black on white.

Attachment 8 (Added)**INFLIGHT PASSENGER SERVICE STEWARD (IPSS) (FLIGHT ATTENDANT'S) UNIFORM**

A8.1. (Added) Dress (Female). Length will be IAW length requirements for the service uniform skirt contained in the basic instruction for this supplement, dress will not be excessively tight. Name tag will contain full name and be worn on the left side of the dress. A scarf or conservative brooch must be worn. Dress must also be worn with belt issued with the dress, if a belt is not issued, then no belt is required, i.e., summer dress. A pocket handkerchief is optional.

A8.2. (Added) Blazer (Female/Male). Civilian style, navy blue. Must have a good tailored fit, and conform to same requirements for the service dress blazer/jacket contained in the basic instruction for this supplement. Name tag will contain full name and be worn on the left side of the blazer. Blazer must be worn in passenger cabins prior to passengers arrival for greeting and prior to landing for passenger deplaning; wear in the cabins during flight is optional.

A8.3. (Added) Skirt/Slacks (Female). Length will be IAW length requirements for the service uniform skirt/slacks contained in the basic instructions for this supplement; skirt/slacks will not be excessively tight; skirt will hang freely when worn. They must be worn with either dress buckle belt, cummerbund belt, or sweater vest. If sweater vest is worn, belt is optional.

A8.4. (Added) Pants (Male). Length will be IAW length requirements for the service uniform pants contained in the basic instruction for this supplement; pants will not be excessively tight. Belt will be worn with pants at all times.

A8.5. (Added) Blouse (Female). Will be conservative in style and color, similar to issued blouse in appearance. Stripes and prints must be conservative. Name tag will contain first name and will be worn on the left side of blouse when worn in cabin without blazer or sweater vest. Long or short sleeves may be worn. Sleeves may be rolled up only while working in the galley, and not at any other time. Blouse will be worn with proper undergarments. Scarf, tie, or conservative brooch must be worn.

A8.6. (Added) Shirts (Male). Will be conservative in style and color, similar to issued shirts in appearance. Stripes and prints must be conservative. Name tag will contain first name and will be worn on the left side of shirt when worn in cabin without blazer or sweater vest. Long or short sleeves may be worn. Sleeves may be rolled up only while working in the galley, and not at any other time. Shirt will be worn with proper undergarments. Tie must be worn.

A8.7. (Added) Special Air Mission (SAM) Aircrew Jacket. Will be worn IAW AMCI 11-202, Volume 1, *89th Airlift Wing (AW) Distinguished Visitor (DV) and Special Airlift Mission (SAM) Airlift Operations*. Will be removed at station time or when passengers are on board aircraft. Jacket will not be worn with the dress or to and from hotels. Rank insignia will be removed when worn with the IPSS uniform.

A8.8. (Added) Overcoat. Same as contained in the basic instruction for this supplement. Can be worn when working on or around aircraft to include station time, outside to greet passengers, with the IPSS dress, and to and from hotels. Rank insignia will be removed when worn with the IPSS uniform.

A8.9. (Added) Shoes (Female/Male). Will be black, conservative, and comply with the basic instruction for this supplement.

A8.10. (Added) Sweater, Vests. Name tag will contain first name and be worn on the left side of vest. May be worn when working on the plane and when performing duties outside the plane prior to station time. May be worn under the blazer.

A8.11. (Added) Socks, Stockings, Undergarments, Hair, Purses. Will be IAW the basic instruction for this supplement.

A8.12. (Added) Apron. May be worn in the galley and cabin on the C-20 during meal service. On the C-9 and C-37 aircraft the apron will be worn only in the galley.

A8.13. (Added) Scarves, Ties, Tie Clasps, Pins, and Brooches. Will be conservative and in good taste.

Attachment 9 (Added)**FUNCTIONAL CLOTHING, COMMONLY USED, AND SPECIALTY ITEMS**

A9.1. (Added) Belt, Blue with Silver Tip Buckle. General officer's belt buckle (general officers only). Worn with functional clothing only.

A9.2. (Added) Boots, Cold Weather (Mukluk, Bunny, and Industrial Cold Weather Safety Boots). Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. May be worn with all uniform combinations when an appropriate outer garment is worn, as authorized by the installation commander. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms. For the aircrew flight uniform refer to [Attachment 5 \(Added\)](#)

A9.3. (Added) Boots, 10-inch Safety. Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.4. (Added) Brassards (Arm Bands). Positioned on the left arm, halfway between the elbow and shoulder, as authorized by the installation commander when performing a duty requiring identification. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.5. (Added) Cap, Maintenance (Bump Hat). Worn in work area only when required in the performance of duty. In no instance will it be worn in public areas on base unless duty is being performed in that area. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.6. (Added) Cap, Stocking (US Navy Watch Cap). Worn when authorized by the installation commander. Worn with battle dress, functional, and aircrew flight uniforms.

A9.7. (Added) Cap, Winter, Olive Green. Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Officer grade insignia is not required if other grade insignia is visible. When worn, officers will wear regular size metal grade insignia centered on the front. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.8. (Added) Coveralls (White, Olive Green, and Tan). Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Wear of name/USAF tapes, badges, grade insignia, and unit emblems will be prescribed by installation commander IAW this supplement and the basic instruction. Worn in the work area only. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.9. (Added) Desert BDUs. Worn as functional clothing only, IAW with Chapter 3 of the basic instruction for this supplement. Accouterments will be placed on the uniform in the same manner as the BDU as prescribed in this supplement and the basic instruction.

A9.10. (Added) Ear Protectors. Authorized with all functional uniforms.

A9.11. (Added) Flight Suit and Jacket (Blue, General Officer). Accouterments may be positioned according to personal preferences. Jacket may be worn with all service uniforms except service dress.

A9.12. (Added) Flight Suits. See [Attachment 5 \(Added\)](#) of this supplement.

A9.13. (Added) Flying Jackets. Worn IAW [Attachment 5 \(Added\)](#) of this supplement as an outer garment with the flight suit, if authorized by appropriate AS and prescribed by the installation commander.

A9.14. (Added) Gloves, Safety and Occupational. Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.15. (Added) Gortex Parka and Pants, Camouflage. Worn if issued through local organizational channels and authorized for wear by the installation commander. This item will be worn IAW Chapter 3, paragraphs 3.1 and 3.1.2, of the basic instruction and AS 016. (Exception: Personnel will not sew or attach any item onto this parka that could damage its waterproof integrity.) Worn with the BDU and hospital whites uniform. (Exception: May be authorized for wear by boom operators, loadmasters, and flight engineers IAW **Attachment 5 (Added)** of this supplement and approval of the installation commander.) Officer and enlisted personnel will wear subdued metal grade insignia centered on the front tab. (**NOTE:** Enlisted subdued metal grade insignia will be worn immediately upon availability through local supply channels.) Nonsubdued metal grade insignia may be worn by officer and enlisted personnel centered on the front tab while in garrison, if authorized by the installation commander. Grade insignia will not be worn if safety requirements prohibit.

A9.16. (Added) Hat, Camouflage Bush. Worn as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander when climate conditions warrant. Subdued officer grade insignia will be worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.17. (Added) Mittens, Cold Weather. Worn when authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.18. (Added) Occupational Protective Clothing or Equipment. Worn when authorized by installation commander. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.19. (Added) Overshoes (Female), Ankle-High, Gray or Black. Worn with BDU and functional clothing when authorized by installation commander. Gray overshoes may be worn with service uniform only when required by inclement weather conditions.

A9.20. (Added) Overshoes (Men), High Black Rubber. Authorized with all functional uniforms (except the aircrew flight uniform) unless prohibited by safety directive.

A9.21. (Added) Overshoes (Male/Female), Synthetic, Black, Clear, or Smoke Plastic. Worn with appropriate outer garment. Trousers may be tucked in when weather conditions warrant. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.22. (Added) Parkas (Extremely cold weather garments, except the Gortex Parka). May be worn if issued through local organizational channels and authorized by installation commander. These items will be worn IAW Chapter 3, paragraphs 3.1 and 3.1.2 of the basic instruction and AS 016. Grade insignia, USAF and name tapes, ASNP, badges, and emblems will not be worn. May be issued upon request and with physician's confirmation to pregnant women during inclement weather. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms. Not authorized for wear with the aircrew flight uniform during flight.

A9.23. (Added) Patch, Emergency Medical Technician. Certified by the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians. May be worn 1/2 inch above the name tag with hospital whites only.

A9.24. (Added) Reflective Vests, Jackets, and Reflective Arm Bands. Must be worn when prescribed by safety directives or installation commander. Worn during periods of reduced visibility at the discretion of the individual, unless otherwise prohibited. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.25. (Added) Scarf, Bib-Type, Camouflaged. Worn with the BDU when issued through local organizational channels.

A9.26. (Added) Shoe, Electric Hazard, Low-Quarter, Black. Worn as authorized by AS 016 and required in the performance of duty. Worn with battle dress, service, and functional uniforms.

A9.27. (Added) Shoes, Low-Quarter, Combat, or Oxfords. Authorized unless safety or occupational footwear is prescribed. Same specification as prescribed for service uniform. Worn with functional uniforms only. Not authorized for wear with the aircrew flight suit uniform during flight.

A9.28. (Added) Sweatband. Elastic cotton stretch material, solid gray, black, or olive green without design. May be worn by flightline members when wear of authorized headgear is deemed inappropriate and is approved by installation commander. Worn with BDUs and on the flightline only.

A9.29. (Added) Sweater, Olive Green. Worn in individual's duty section only. Will not be worn as an outer garment in public areas on base unless duty is being performed in that area. May be worn under an outer garment if not visible. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.30. (Added) Tape, Reflectorized. Worn on functional clothing only as required by safety directives and prescribed by the installation commander.

A9.31. (Added) Trousers, Cold Weather. Worn as an outer garment as authorized by AS 016 and prescribed by the installation commander. Must be worn with parka. Worn with battle dress and functional uniforms.

A9.32. (Added) Turtleneck, Long Sleeves. NOMEX, brown or black, may be worn with aircrew flight uniforms and other functional uniforms.

A9.33. (Added) Underwear, NOMEX. Worn with aircrew flight uniform and functional clothing only.

A9.34. (Added) Underwear, Thermal, Natural Colored (Undershorts and Undershirt). Worn as weather conditions warrant. Worn with battle dress, service, functional, and aircrew flight uniforms.

Attachment 10 (Added)**IC 2002-02 TO AFI 36-2903, AMCSUP1, DRESS AND PERSONAL APPEARANCE OF AIR FORCE PERSONNEL****12 SEPTEMBER 2002**

AFI 36-2903, 1 November 2001, is supplemented as follows. This publication applies to AMC, AMC-gained Air National Guard (ANG) units upon mobilization and when published in ANGIND 2, and Air Force Reserve Command (AFRC) units and tenants units located on AMC host installations. Authority to publish is HQ AFPC/DPSFC Memorandum, 18 June 1997. **The OPR for this supplement is HQAMC/DPFMS (TSgt Davis).** The purpose of this supplement is to continue the process of forming one mobility culture. The changes to aircrew flight uniforms comprise elements from various backgrounds to simplify their wear within AMC. The transition to cloth sewn-on rank on the flight suit is an enhancement to safety in and around our aircraft in lieu of rank being attached by velcro and standardizes the wear of rank insignia. These changes also bring something from each of the individual cultures that have formed AMC. The use of the name or mark of any specific manufacturer, commercial product, commodity, or service in this publication does not imply endorsement by the Air Force.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This interim change (IC) 02-01 verifies that the new AFI 36-2903, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel*, 1 November 2001 does not affect the content of the existing supplement. This IC changes the purpose statement to reflect the date of the new basic. The date of the supplement has changed and **Attachment 10 (Added)** has been added.
