**PROTECTION OF USAF RESOURCES**

**COMPLIANCE WITH THIS INSTRUCTION IS MANDATORY**

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This instruction implements AFPD 31-2, *Law Enforcement* and the policy, guidelines, and procedures to be used in protecting USAF physical resources under the jurisdiction of the Installation Commander, exclusive of Priority A, B or C aerospace operational resources (see AFI 31-101 Vol 1, *The Air Force Physical Security Program*). It implements 50 U.S.C. 797, DoD Directive 5200.8-R, *Physical Security Program*, and AFI 31-209, *The Air Force Resource Protection Program*. This instruction does not lessen the requirements of any other Air Force directive for the protection of specific items, funds facilities, documents or categories of information. (Examples: drugs, nonappropriated funds, ammunition storage areas, investigative reports, classified documents or material, etc.) It is applicable to all personnel assigned or attached to the 452 Air Mobility Wing, tenant units supported by this base, and personnel transiting March ARB.

**1. Authority.**

1.1. This instruction is issued under the authority of Section 21 of the Internal Security Act of 1950 (50 USC 797), and AFI 31-209.

1.2. The Installation Commander is empowered to remove any person, military or civilian, for any on-base violation of a lawful directive.

1.3. Any lawful directives issued by the Installation Commander are enforceable against all persons, whether or not those persons are subject to the Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ).

1.4. Directives issued by a properly designated Air Force commander are enforceable against persons under that commander's jurisdiction who are subject to the UCMJ.

1.5. The authority to enforce lawful base regulations issued by the Installation Commander, is delegated to the 452 SPS, Installation Chief of Security Police, to include apprehension of military, and detention of civilian offenders.

1.6. The Installation Commander has the authority to issue barment orders, written or oral, to remove persons from the installation and direct them not to reenter. Reentry to the confines of

March Air Reserve Base (MARB) after removal is grounds for criminal prosecution under Title 18, U.S.C. 1382.

1.7. Security Police personnel are authorized to bear weapons in the performance of official duties, subject to the requirements of AFI 31-207, *Arming and Use of Force by Air Force Personnel*.

2. **Installation Boundary.** That portion of the March Air Reserve Base cantonment area established by the Base Realignment and Closure agency (BRAC) which is generally located south of Cactus Avenue, East of Highway 215, West of Riverside and Heacock Drives, and north of Oleander Avenue. A fence with Installation Warning Signs posted in accordance with AFI 31-209, surrounds the base perimeter. There are four islands situated outside of the cantonment area proper that are included as part of the base. The areas are the base firing range, located to the west of highway 215 on Village West Drive, the AFOSI/AFAA/Recruiting Squadron complex, bordered by 4th, 8th, and Z streets, the Ground Receiver Site, located on 5th Street, west of highway 215, and the sewage treatment plant, located on the west side of highway 215, north of Oleander Street. All islands are surrounded by a fence with warning signs placed in accordance with AFI 31-209.

3. **Installation Designation.** March Air Reserve Base supports, on a day to day basis, priority resources as designated within AFPD 31-1, *Physical Security*. For this reason, MARB is designated as a closed base and all entry control points will be staffed with armed Security Police personnel.

4. **Entry Circulation Control Procedures.** The amount, type and degree of sensitive USAF resources that are maintained on MARB, dictates that certain procedures be established to regulate personnel and vehicular movements into and out of this installation.

4.1. Specific permission of the Installation Commander is required to enter this Installation. During normal duty hours or day to day operations, such permission is implied and the Chief, Security Police is authorized to grant permission for personnel meeting the following requirements.

4.1.1 Presenting valid identification credentials as described in AFI 36-3001, *Identification Cards for Members of the Uniformed Services, Their Family Members, and other Eligible Personnel*, or the equivalent credentials issued by an agency of the Department of Defense or other U.S. Government agency and a need to enter the installation.

4.1.2. Vehicles that are operated by personnel who meet the above requirements, and have affixed on their vehicle, proper vehicle identification stickers (DD Form 2220, **DoD Registered Vehicle**) and/or credentials issued according to AFR 125-14, *Motor Vehicle Traffic Supervision*.

4.1.3. Persons requesting to operate a privately owned vehicle (POV) will affirm that all proper requirements, as stated within AFR 125-14, are met prior to them being allowed to operate or

register their vehicles on this facility. When such permission is granted, the visitor consents to a search of his/her vehicle upon entering or departing this installation.

4.1.4. Detailed procedures for installation entry controls are found within the Installation Security Plan (ISP), and appropriate Security Police Operating Instruction (s).

5. **Restricted Areas.** Specific written permission is required before entry is allowed within Restricted Areas located on MARB. Authority and Entry Circulation Control Procedures are covered within the Installation Security Plan (ISP) and AFIs.

6. **Controlled Areas.** Certain areas, buildings, and/or facilities within the installation have been designated as Controlled Areas. Entrance into these areas without the installation commander's consent is prohibited. The operating official responsible for that function will grant such permission and control entry into their areas. All controlled areas will be specifically marked by signs as outlined in AFI 31-209. The following functional areas are designated as controlled areas:

7. **Posting of Regulations and Signs.** Installation Warning Signs will be posted at all vehicle and personnel entry points, and the base perimeter will be posted with warning signs at no more than 100 yard intervals. All Controlled Areas will be posted as required by AFI 31-209, and Restricted Areas in accordance with AFI 31-101 Vol 1.

8. **Intrusion Detection Equipment (IDE).** Procedures and responsibilities associated with agencies employing IDE will be IAW the Installation Security Plan.
