**SUMMARY OF REVISIONS**

Renumbered and updated all paragraphs to correspond with basic manual. Updated detail numbers to identify deployable bench stock assets. New or revised material is indicated by an ( | ).

**AFM 23-110, Volume 2, Part Two, Chapter 25, is supplemented as follows:**

25.4.6. (Added) Hazardous Material. Hazardous material will not be authorized/stored on bench stock.

25.8.2. (Added) Identify bench stock items designated to support a deployable bench stock (DBS). Use detail numbers 0001-4999 to identify non-deployable bench stock items. Identify deployable bench stock items with detail numbers 5000-9999. On hand deployable bench stock line items may be sub-located to facilitate immediate deployment; however, organizations must exhaust assets in both, the primary and sub-location prior to submitting a firm backorder. At no time will on-hand bench stock balances exceed 200 percent of authorization. See Chapter 26, PACAF Sup 1 for further guidance concerning DBS.

25.23.2. Bench stock will be reviewed quarterly for additions, changes and deletions unless the Chief of Supply requires this review to be accomplished more frequently.
