AIR FORCE PERSONNEL**

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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AFI 36-2903, 8 June 1998 and AMC 1, dated 25 July 1997 are supplemented as follows:

Changes/revisions to this supplement require 60 AMW/CC approval. This supplement applies to all Air Force active duty, National Guard and Reserve personnel on Travis Air Force Base.

Table 1.1. (Added) Civilian Clothing Dress Standards for Dining Facility Patrons.

Clothing	must be neat, clean, conservative, and in good taste. May not contain any obscene words or pictures.
Undergarments	may not be worn as outergarments or be visible from under other clothing.
Footwear	must be worn. Shower shoes and bare feet are prohibited.
Halter, Tube and Tank Tops	prohibited. Shirts exposing underarms are prohibited.
Cutoffs and Shorts	must be neat, clean and not ripped or torn, nor reveal any portion of the buttocks.
Hair Curlers	will not be worn.
Headgear	will be removed upon entry into the dining facility.
Fitness Attire	will not be worn if obviously sweaty or soiled.

Table 1.1 (AMC)(Added). Military personnel assigned to the 60th Medical Group are authorized the following uniform items while performing military duties within the Health and Wellness Center: Blue nylon warm-up suit, khaki trousers, or khaki shorts. Teal or white cotton polo shirt with HAWC logo on the left side and HAWC identification tag or embroidered rank/name on right side. Blue cotton/polyester shorts or blue warm-up pants (at personal discretion) may be worn during the period of 1 April - 30 October. Footwear will be appropriate athletic shoes. Socks will be white. Outer wear will include navy blue windbreaker with teal liner or teal fleece pullover with HAWC logo on left side and embroidered rank/name on right side. Commander, 60th Medical Group will designate the above in a 60 MDG Operating Instruction (OI). This will be reviewed by 60 AMW/CC for final approval.

Table 1.1 (AMC)(Added). Military personnel assigned to 60th Services Squadron are authorized the following uniform items while performing military duties within the fitness center. Black docker/khaki style pants, grey short sleeve cotton golf shirt with Travis Fitness and Sports Patch on the left side and Services Squadron nametag on the right side with rank insignia. Black walking shorts, the length of shorts must be professional length and run mid thigh, with a minimum of a four-six inch inseam. Footwear will be black/white athletic or walking shoes. Socks will be white with shorts or black pants. Hat will be black with Services Squadron silver lettering. Gray crew neck sweatshirt with Travis Sports and Fitness Patch on left side with name tag and rank insignia on the right will be worn over the basic shirt with collar properly displayed outside the sweatshirt. Black warm-up jacket with Travis Sports and Fitness Patch on left side with nametag and rank insignia on the right side. The Commander, 60th Services Squadron will designate the above in a 60 SVS Operating Instruction (OI). This will be reviewed by 60 AMW/CC for final approval.

Table 1.1 (AMC)(Added). Military personnel assigned to 60th Air Mobility Wing Protocol Office are authorized the following uniform items while performing military duties as directed by the Protocol Chief: Khaki Dockers style trousers, white protocol polo shirt with 60 AMW emblem on left side, embroidered rank and name on right side. Footwear will be brown, closed-toe shoes with no heel. No hat will be worn with this uniform.

Table 1.1 (AMC)(Added). Military personnel assigned to 60th Services Squadron are authorized the following uniform items while performing military duties within the dining facilities. The white food service uniform may be altered to have a white high collar, four breasted, and chef style jacket with official Air Force Food Service logo, embroidered above the left breast pocket. A corresponding color coded apron and scarf designating skill level will be worn. The scarf will be worn around the collar and enclosed with the Air Mobility Command's emblem ring. Additionally, the corresponding color coded chef hat designating skill level will be worn. The Air Force ultramarine blue name tag will be on the right breast side, centered, with the bottom edge parallel to the bottom edge of the Air Force Food Service logo. The bright blue/silver metal rank insignia will be worn one inch above the name tag. White pants and black shoes or boots will be worn. NOTE: The chef style uniform will be worn in the dining facilities only. Personnel will be required to wear the white shirt as prescribed in AFI 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel, when outside the dining facilities.

Notes (ADDED):

1. All military personnel have the responsibility to comply and challenge violations to Air Force standards.
2. Civilian clothing that is offensive, obscene, racist, or contains words or pictures that are offensive, obscene, or racist may not be worn on Travis AFB at any time.
3. The dining facility manager or a designated representative's decision concerning what constitutes inappropriate dress will be final.

Table 2.2.

Line 6. (AMC)(Added). BDU cap will be worn in all exercises, deployments, and contingency events by all personnel. The subdued metal insignia will be worn by officers when in exercises, deployments, and contingency events. Officers must wear the bright metal insignia when in garrison.

Line 6. (AMC)(Added). Only authorized organizational ball caps may be worn. All requests for organizational ball caps must be submitted in accordance with basic design requirements. All requests will be submitted to the MPF and approved in writing by the 60 AMW/CC prior to wear (See [Attachment 1](#) for current authorized listing).

Line 6, Headgear. (AMC)(Added). Between 1 October and 30 April of each year, personnel who normally perform duties outside during cold or inclement weather may wear the black wool watch-cap when performing those specific duties. Watch-caps will not be worn outside the immediate work area. Watch caps may not be worn with sleeves rolled up, without the BDU jacket or gortex jacket being worn.

Line 11. (AMC)(Added). Only authorized brown or black undershirts may be worn. All requests for organizational undershirts must be submitted to the MPF for final approval by the 60 AMW/CC. Organizational BDU undershirts may only be black in color with approved multi or single color designs not larger than five inches in diameter. (See [Attachment 2](#) for current authorized listing.)

Line 11. (AMC)(Added). Long-sleeved black or brown turtlenecks, dickies, or thermal undershirts (all without pockets) may be worn under the BDU shirt from 1 October to 30 April of each year. Organizational issued green wool sweaters and sleepshirts may also be worn under the BDU shirt from 1 October to 30 April of each year. None of these items may be worn by themselves as an outer garment.

Line 13, Other. (AMC)(Added). The gortex jacket must have the cloth slip-on insignia on the tab at all times when in uniform. The only exception is when working in the immediate vicinity of operating air-

craft. The metal rank insignia may no longer be worn. The gortex jacket may be worn with civilian clothing when off-duty. When it is worn with civilian clothing, the cloth insignia must be removed.

Table 2.4.

Line 9. (AMC)(Added). The BDU cap will be worn in all exercises, deployments, and contingency events by all personnel. The subdued metal insignia will be worn by officers when in exercises, deployments, and contingency events. Officers must wear the bright metal insignia when in garrison.

Line 9. (AMC)(Added). Only authorized organizational ball caps may be worn. All requests for organizational ball caps must be submitted in accordance with basic design requirements. All requests will be submitted to the MPF and approved in writing by the 60 AMW/CC prior to wear (See [Attachment 1](#) for current authorized listing).

Line 9, Headgear. (AMC)(Added). Between 1 October and 30 April of each year, personnel who normally perform duties outside during cold or inclement weather may wear the black wool watch-cap when performing those specific duties. Watch-caps will not be worn outside the immediate work area. May not be worn with sleeves rolled up or without the BDU jacket or Gortex jacket being worn.

Line 14. (AMC)(Added). Only authorized brown or black undershirts may be worn. All requests for organizational undershirts must be submitted to the MPF for final approval by the 60 AMW/CC. Organizational BDU undershirts may only be black in color with approved multi or single color designs not larger than five inches in diameter. (See [Attachment 2](#) for current authorized listing.)

Line 14. (AMC)(Added). Long-sleeved black or brown turtlenecks, dickies, or thermal undershirts (all without pockets) may be worn under the BDU shirt from 1 October to 30 April of each year. Organizational issued green or brown wool sweaters and sleepshirts may also be worn under the BDU shirt from 1 October to 30 April of each year. None of these items may be worn by themselves as an outer garment.

Line 16, Other. (AMC)(Added). The gortex jacket must have the cloth sleeve insignia on the tab at all times when in uniform. The only exception is when working in the immediate vicinity of operating aircraft. The gortex jacket may be worn with civilian clothing when off-duty. When it is worn with civilian clothing, the cloth insignia must be removed.

Line 17, Other. (AMC)(Added). Headgear: Hoods of parkas, field jackets, gortex jackets, and other outer garments are not considered headgear. When outdoors appropriate headgear must be worn at all times under the hoods of these outer garments.

Table 2.5.

Item 4. (AMC)(Added). Bracelets are limited to those jewelry items normally worn around the wrist. Anklets or bracelets worn around the ankle are not authorized while in uniform.

Item 18. (AMC)(Added). Column A; line badges, controlled entry badges, special identification badges. Column B; these items may be worn in clear vinyl arm band holders or attached to the shirt pockets and must be clearly visible when in areas which require such badges. These badges will be removed and not be visible when not in areas requiring their wear.

Table 2.7. (AMC)(Added) Designated No-Hat Areas.

Headgear is optional in the following areas:	Covered walkway between the 60th Dental Clinic and David Grant Medical Center.
	All outdoor patio areas within David Grant Medical Center.
	Covered walking areas outside the BX and Commissary.
	Inside the aircraft flightline red line and flightline security rope areas, and all aircraft parking and taxi areas.
	Transportation Squadron's main vehicle compound and area immediately adjacent to vehicle maintenance shops (located within the Transportation Compound).
	The CEMIRT maintenance complex (Building 1205), to include outdoor maintenance and storage areas.
	Explosive Ordinance Disposal's Proficiency Training Range.
	C-5 aircrew fenced area inside Building 150 and Building 155.
	Covered walkways between workcenters in Building 243 and 241.

NoteS. (AMC)(ADDED):

1. Headgear must be worn outdoors at all times unless in a designated no-hat area.
2. A hat is not required while riding a two-wheel vehicle/bike with appropriate safety headgear.
3. All other areas must be requested in writing through the 60 SPTG/CC, 60 AMW/CCC, and approved by 60 AMW/CC.

Table 3.2. (AMC)(Added)

The following uniforms and accessories are authorized for wear by honor guard personnel. Battle Dress Uniform: On training days, the Battle Dress Uniform (BDU) will be worn with the black ascot, Travis Honor Guard patch, and Travis Honor Guard baseball cap. Part-time honor guard commanders are authorized wear of black aiguillette without tassel, worn grounded on the left shoulder seam. Part-time Master Guardsmen are authorized wear of black aiguillette with tassel worn grounded on left shoulder seam. Honor guard staff members who are not Master Guardsmen are authorized wear of red aiguillette without tassel, grounded on left shoulder seam. Honor Guard staff members who are Master Guardsmen are authorized wear of red aiguillette with tassel, grounded on left shoulder seam. Wear of aiguillettes with the BDU by honor guard staff members is authorized outside the duty section when worn with the Travis Honor Guard baseball cap. Wear of aiguillettes with the BDU by part-time honor guard personnel is authorized out of the normal duty section when worn with the Travis Honor Guard baseball cap and in the normal duty section if they do not interfere with normal operations. Ceremonial Uniform: The ceremonial uniform may be worn at the normal duty section on the day of the detail if it does not interfere with the unit's normal operations. The lightweight blue jacket may be worn when traveling to and from ceremonial details. The base honor guard badge may be worn by current honor guard members only.

3.1.3. (AMC)(Added). When gortex jackets are worn, the appropriate cloth slip-on rank insignia must be worn on the gortex jacket. Metal rank insignia is no longer authorized for wear on the tab. Gortex items may be worn with BDUs, food service whites, or hospital whites only. Gortex items may not be worn with any blue service uniform combination. Gortex pants may not be worn without the gortex jacket.

3.1.4. (AMC)(Added). Boots, cold weather (bunny boots, mukluks, and industrial cold weather boots) are not authorized for wear at Travis AFB.

3.1.5. (AMC)(Added). Safety toe boots: Ten inch and other safety toe boots are authorized for wear by those personnel allowed under ASC-016, *Allowance Source Code*. This includes certain personnel assigned to aircraft maintenance, CES, Aerial Port, and other units involved in heavy equipment or cargo operation/movement.

3.1.6. (AMC)(Added). Commander, 60 MDG, will designate in a MDG Operating Instruction (OI) guidance for wearing special purpose medical clothing and other medical clothing items unique to the mission needs of 60 Medical Group (David Grant Medical Center, DGMC). This includes surgery scrubs, radiation badges, DGMC identification badges, etc. This OI will be reviewed by 60 AMW/ CC for final approval.

Table 3.6. (AMC)(Added)

Leather A-2 Flying Jacket is authorized for wear as prescribed in AFI 36-2903, *Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel*. Authorized members are defined as those to whom the jacket was issued, are currently in a flying AFSC or have been permanently awarded aeronautical badges evidenced by authorization letter from the commanding officers of flying units.

A1.7. (AMC)(Added). Gortex jackets are authorized. Officers and enlisted personnel will wear the cloth grade slip-on insignia centered on the front tab. Grade insignia will not be worn if safety requirements prohibit it.

A1.19. (AMC)(Added). Distinctive unit scarves are authorized with flight suits. The below listed units are authorized to wear the following scarves:

Table A1.1. (AMC)(Added) Authorized Unit Scarves.

15th Air Force	White scarf with 15th Air Force emblems.
60 AMW Staff	Blue and Gold scarf with "Golden Gate" and "Travis Team" logos.
6 ARS	White scarf with KC-10's between blue lines.
9 ARS	Red scarf with squadron patch. Small blue circles with KC-10's in them.
21 AS	Black scarf with 21 AS separated by a C-5. White lettering with "B-Liner's" on bottom portion of scarf.
22 AS	Red and white scarf with squadron colored patch.

A5.4. (AMC)(Added). Blue and gray brassards (armbands) may be worn when immediate identification is required. Granted by 60 SPTG/CC when necessary.

A5.15. (AMC)(Added). Gortex Parka and Pants. Personnel will not sew or attach any item onto this parka. It may be worn with BDUs, hospital white and food service white uniforms.

A5.17. (AMC)(Added). Mittens, cold weather type, may not be worn.

A5.24. (AMC)(Added). Reflective vests, jackets, and armbands may be worn but must be removed when the official duties requiring their wear is no longer being performed.

A5.30. (AMC)(Added). Reflective tape may be worn on functional clothing as required by local safety directives.
