AIRCREW TRAINING

COMPLIANCE WITH THIS PUBLICATION IS MANDATORY

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AFI 11-202 Volume 1, 1 December 1997, is supplemented as follows: This instruction, as well as the lead AFI applies to all personnel operating Academy MDS and Non-MDS designated aircraft. Submit recommendations for improvement to this supplement on AF Form 847, **Recommendation for Change of Publication**, through training channels to 34 OSS/OST. This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

2.1. For USAFA, the 34 TRW/CC is the MAJCOM/DO equivalent. Waivers to this supplement will be handled by 34 OSS/OST. The 34 TRW/CC is the waiver authority for specific aircrew training requirements not addressed by AFI 11-2MDS-Specific, Vol 1.

1.4.2. 34 OSS/OST is responsible for the overall management of USAFA's aircrew training programs.

1.4.2.1. All aircrew members will receive theater indoctrination training through MDS-specific syllabus ground school. Squadron-level training managers will ensure lesson plans cover, as a minimum, local weather, local area procedures of all USAFA aircraft/jumpers, Supervisor of Flying/DZCO coordination, divert airfields/landing sites, and the airfield environment.

1.4.2.2. NVGs are not currently used in USAFA aircraft.

1.4.2.4.2. 34 OSS/OST will schedule MDS-specific training conferences biennially, or more frequently if required. TG-3, TG-4 and TG-9 programs may be combined in one conference.

1.4.2.4.3. The USAFA Rated Manager will determine the number of pilot training quotas required in each MDS (assigned and attached). The 98 FTS/CC will determine the number of jumpmaster training quotas required (assigned and attached). The 94 FTS/CC and 98 FTS/CC will determine the number of cadet instructor training quotas required in each flying program.

1.4.2.5.1. 34 OSS/OST manages and 34 OG/CC approves all aircrew training syllabi. USAFA is exempt from processing changes through AFCAT 36-2223, *USAF Formal Schools*.

1.4.2.5.2. USAFA may host FCRs in conjunction with MDS-specific training conferences.

1.4.2.5.3. Squadrons will notify the 34 OG/CC when a noncadet student fails to progress according to syllabus requirements. The 34 OG/CC will hold a Progress Review (PR) Board to determine if the student will continue in training, and the extent of any additional training granted. The squadron providing training will supply a progress review package to include, as a minimum, the student's training records, a written statement by the student, a written recommendation by the squadron commander, and the student's Flight Evaluation Folder. The PR Board will consist of the 34 OG/CC, two Squadron Commanders, 34 OG/OGV, 34 OG/OGVP (if relevant), the student's primary instructor, and a minimum of one of the student's peers.

2.2. Before entering qualification training, each aircrew member must comply with the appropriate training prerequisites prescribed in the MDS-specific syllabus, and in AFI 11-202, Vol 1, paragraphs 2.2.1 and 2.2.2. USAF Academy cadets participating in aviation and parachuting programs are exempt from flight physical examinations and physiological training. Squadrons may impose more restrictive guidance.

2.3. Squadrons will only use 34 OG/CC approved courseware.

2.6. 34 OSS/OST will develop and coordinate in-unit training plans and syllabi for aircraft conversions through the 34 TRW/CC (MAJCOM/DO). The 34 OG/CC will designate initial cadre personnel.

2.7. 34 TRW/CC (MAJCOM/DO) may authorize qualification in more than one MDS aircraft in accordance with the lead AFI. 34 TRW/CC approval is not required when the multiple qualification includes any sailplane (i.e. TG-4 then TG-7, or TG-11 then TG-4, or TG-4 then TG-3, etc.)

2.9. Flight surgeons wishing to fly in USAFA aircraft must comply with guidance in AFI 11-2MDS-specific, Vols 1 and 2.

4.2. The USAFA Rated Manager will determine the unit of attachment for all attached staff personnel in flying positions.

4.3.2. Continuation training programs are defined in AFI 11-2MDS-specific, Vols 1.

4.4.1. Crewmembers qualified in more than one aircraft will follow currency requirements listed in AFI-11-2MDS-specific, Vols 1.

4.12. USAFA flight surgeons are exempt from the night currency requirements.

6.6. Submit courseware changes through training channels to 34 OSS/OST for approval by 34 OG/CC.
