This instruction implements AFD36-29, *Military Standards*, and establishes the order of precedence for all military personnel at United States Air Force (USAF) Academy-sponsored events. It applies to USAF Academy personnel.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed.

The order of precedence was changed to include the new position of Mobility Assistant to the Superintendent and to reflect the re-designation of the Vice Superintendent position to Director of Staff. Paragraphs **3.1.** and **3.2.** were slightly modified for clarification.

- 1. Reference.** Current USAF General Officer Relative Rank List.
- 2. Order of Precedence.** Use the following precedence at USAF Academy-sponsored events:

Superintendent (HQ USAFA/CC)
Assistant to the Superintendent (HQ USAFA/CR)
Commander, 34th Training Wing (Commandant of Cadets) (34 TRW/CC)
Dean of the Faculty (HQ USAFA/DF)
Commander, 10th Air Base Wing (10 ABW/CC)
Commander, Preparatory School (HQ USAFA/PL)
Director of Staff (HQ USAFA/DS)
Director of Athletics (34 TRW/AH)

Other colonels by date of rank (DOR)

Other personnel by grade and DOR

3. When to Alter the Order of Precedence:

3.1. At events sponsored by the 34 TRW/CC, follow the normal precedence except to place the 34th Training Wing Vice Commander for Strategy, 34th Training Wing Vice Commander for Operations after the 10 ABW/CC, and the HQ USAFA/PL Commander but before other colonels.

3.2. At events sponsored by the Dean of the Faculty, place the Dean following the Superintendent and before the 34 TRW/CC. Also, place the Vice Dean following the HQ USAFA/PL Commander, and before other colonels.

4. Deviating From the Order of Precedence. You may deviate from the order of precedence with good reason and using good judgment. Please contact Protocol (HQ USAFA/CCP) if you have any questions.
