10TH SECURITY FORCES SQUADRON

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This mission directive prescribes the mission, organization, and responsibilities of the 10th Security Forces Squadron, Headquarters United States Air Force Academy, Colorado.

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

This document is substantially revised and must be completely reviewed. A bar (|) indicates revisions from the previous edition, USAFAMD13.

- 1. Authority.** AFI38-101, *Air Force Organization*, as implemented by DAF/PE 690r letter, 13 October 1994, Organization Actions Affecting Certain United States Air Force Academy Units, and Special Order Number GS-13, Headquarters US Air Force Academy, 16 July 1997.
- 2. Mission.** Equips, trains and organizes assigned personnel to provide force protection for the Air Force Academy. Provides patrol responses to crimes and incidents; conducts investigations; enforces and maintains standards of conduct and discipline pursuant to the Uniform Code of Military Justice, (UCMJ); provides protection of government resources against theft, damages, and hostile attacks; provides staff assistance to owner/user personnel in the protection of government resources; enforces traffic rules and instructions on USAF Academy roadways; maintains supervision and detention of prisoners; provides staff supervision of the USAF Academy information, personnel, and industrial security programs; provides ground weapons training and maintenance, including munitions management; organizes, trains and equips two 13 -person mobility teams.
- 3. Organization.** The 10th Security Forces Squadron is assigned to the 10th Mission Support Group, which is assigned to the 10th Air Base Wing. The 10th Security Forces Squadron is comprised of the Administration and Reports Flight, Training and Resources Flight, Operations Flight, and Commanders Support Flight.

4. Responsibilities. The 10th Security Forces Squadron Commander:

- 4.1. Provides force protection for people and resources.
- 4.2. Administers law enforcement functions.
- 4.3. Conducts investigations as required.
- 4.4. Provides oversight of information, personnel, and industrial security programs.
- 4.5. Controls base traffic and investigates motor vehicle accidents.
- 4.6. Maintains registration for privately owned vehicles and firearms.
- 4.7. Maintains liaison with local civil law enforcement agencies.
- 4.8. Establishes procedures for training, deploying, and equipping Security Forces.
- 4.9. Maintains Air Base Defense units designed for deployment to main operating bases, limited operating bases, and bare bases.
- 4.10. Provides ground weapons training and maintenance
- 4.11. The 10th Security Forces Squadron Commander, or superior commanders, may impose nonjudicial punishment on military members assigned to the 10th Security Forces Squadron.
- 4.12. Integrates operational risk management principles, techniques, and tools into policy, planning, education, and training to induce application by personnel at all levels and in all functional areas.

5. Relationship to Other Units or Agencies. Direct communication with other US Air Force Academy agencies, Headquarters US Air Force, Secretary of the Air Force, other US Air Force MAJCOMs, and other Department of Defense agencies and activities is authorized.

6. Records Disposition. Units who create paper or electronic records are to comply in accordance with AFMAN37-139, *Records Disposition Schedule*, for maintenance and disposal of records.
