This mission directive prescribes the mission, organization, and responsibilities of the 94th flying Training Squadron, Headquarters United States Air Force Academy, Colorado

SUMMARY OF REVISIONS

Updated responsibilities and added mandatory statements required from the offices of Safety and Records Disposition Schedule. A “[” indicates revised material since the last edition.

- 1. Authority.** AFI 38-101, *Air Force Organization*, as implemented by DAF/PE 680r, letter, 30 September 1994, Organization Actions Affecting Certain United States Air Force Academy Units, and Special Order Number GS-2, Headquarters US Air Force Academy, 21 October 1994.
- 2. Mission.** Responsible for administering the overall Soaring Program.
- 3. Organization.** The 94th Flying Training Squadron is assigned to the Headquarters 34th Operations Group. The 94th Flying Training Squadron is comprised of the Soar-for-All flight, Upgrade flight, Training flight, Stan/Eval flight, Cadet Soaring team, Cadet Aerobatic team, and the Cadet Powered Flight team.
- 4. Responsibilities.** The 94th Flying Training Squadron Commander:
 - 4.1. Conducts and supervises flight line training for cadets; responsible for administering TG-7A ground training to assigned and attached rated officers.
 - 4.2. Responsible for administering AM 461, Cadet Instructor Pilot Upgrade Course; conducts and supervises flight line training for cadets.
 - 4.3. Responsible for all aspects of advanced training to include aerobatics, cross-country, and wave programs; conducts and supervises sailplane demonstrations and competitions.

4.4. Conducts and supervises all ground and flight training for T-41s, and provides airlift support for US Air Force Academy commanders.

4.5. The 94th Flying Training Squadron Commander, or the 34th Operations Group Commander, may impose non-judicial punishment on military members assigned to the 94th Flying Training Squadron.

4.6. The Headquarters 34th Training Wing provides administrative and orderly room support for assigned personnel.

4.7. Integrates operational risk management principles, techniques, and tools into policy, planning, education, and training to induce application by personnel at all levels and in all functional areas.

5. Relationship to Other Units or Agencies. Direct communication with other US Air Force Academy agencies, Headquarters US Air Force, Secretary of the Air Force, other US Air Force MAJCOMs, and other Department of Defense agencies and activities will normally be coordinated through the 34th Operations Group direct time critical communications that support mission objectives are authorized and do not require the 34th Operations Group coordination.

6. Records Disposition. Units who create paper or electronic records are to comply in accordance with AFMAN 37-139, *Records Disposition Schedule*, for maintenance and disposal of records.
